Housing Shortage Down Under Beat by Cash Prizes For Ideas

WELLINGTON, N.Z. (CP)—To beat the housing shortage in New Zealand the government is offering the equivalent of \$3,000 in cash prizes for ideas on how to reduce building costs. The government has decided that cheaper homes are the answer to the situation rather than building loans or larger programs of government house building. It believes that if building prices can be brought down the people will rush to build houses of their own, and so beat the shortage more effectively than any elaborate scheme of finance or public construction. Already it has conducted research into better-organized building, simpler designs and fittings, and greater efficiency and economy. It has called a national housing conference at which problems will be discussed with the building trade. 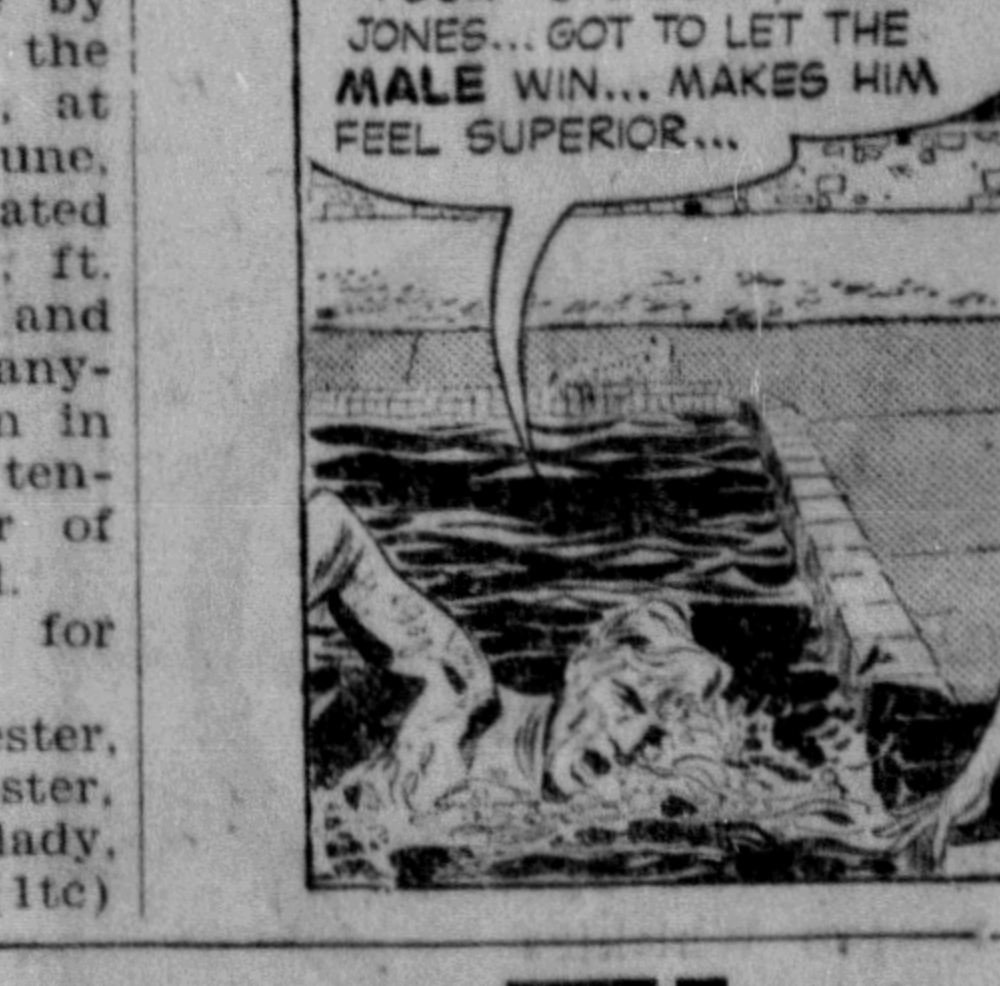
