

BONN (P)-West German publishers have definitely refused to accept delivery of 2,000 tons of newsprint from Canada because of cheaper Scandinavian paper, here the economics ministry announced Tuesday. Emergency allocation of 2,000

tons of newsprint from Canada was granted West Germany last January to overcome an acute shortage. Price had been fixed at \$209 per ton.

Meanwhile, West German publishers obtained needed printing paper from Scandinavian manufacturers at \$155 a ton.

The ministry announced it has informed Canadian exporters of accept delivery "after negotiations with Canadians for a price
