**BLACKWOOD on Bridge**

**Strong Slam Implications Seen In Jump Takeout Bid**

As used today, the jump takeout of partner's opening bid is not only forcing to game. It also has strong slam implications. My observations indicate that, after an opening bid and a jump takeout by partner, a slam is reached more than half of the time.

It was not clear to Mr. Muzzy where today's hand would be played until he heard Mrs. Keen's third bid—that is, her four diamond bid. On the first round, Mrs. Keen jumped to two spades to make sure the bidding would not be dropped under game. On the second round, there was still no hurry about showing her fine diamond support. She showed her heart strength instead. At this point the hand was a misfit as far as Mr. Muzzy knew. But when Mrs. Keen bid four diamonds on the next round, the situation cleared up. Mr. Muzzy properly bid four no trump, intending to pass if his partner bid five diamonds, showing just one ace. When Mrs. Keen showed two aces, he went on to slam.

Mr. Muzzy bid surprisingly well. But as usual, he fell down in the play. The deuce of spades was opened and won with dummy's ace. A small diamond was led. Mr. Champion ducked and the seven in the closed hand won.

Another diamond lead to dummy's king was won by Mr. Champion with the ace. Of course, Mr. Champion made the right return, another diamond, and now Mr. Muzzy was unable to ruff more than one of his losing clubs. He placed another club on dummy's king of spades but still had to surrender a club to Mr. Dale.

After winning trick two with the seven of diamonds, Mr. Muzzy should have abandoned trumps. His better play was to cash the ace and king of clubs and ruff a third round of clubs on the board. If Mr. Champion over-ruffed, it would take his ace to do it and the best he could do after that was to lead his last diamond. But on this

sequence of plays, there would still be a trump in dummy to ruff another club loser.

If Mr. Champion elected not to over-ruff dummy on the third lead of clubs, Mr. Muzzy could have discarded a club on the king of spades entered his hand with the king of hearts and ruffed his last losing club on the board. Either way, 12 tricks were available.
