A correspondent having failed to purchase Monel wire, seeks an alternative. (Monel is out due to defence requirements.) stout rod (good fibreglass are available in town) about 61/2 feet, a Pennreel No. 149 or No. 249, and 300 to 500 feet of 20- to 23gauge soft copper wire makes a good setup. Be sure to insert a dozen feet of 48-pound Cuttyhunk at the 150-foot mark, and at say 60-foot intervals a couple more places; this is so that the depth will be known and preclude having wire at the rod tip during trolling, for the wire will quickly break the rod vibration created by the working lure.
