Mr. Champion had no difficulty making four spades and he wanted to know why Mr. New had soft-pedalled the hand. Mr. New's answer is typical. "I bid my hand," he said, with a selfrighteous tone in his voice. "I opened the bidding and promptly raised you in spades. What else do you want me to do?"

Mr. Champion was scornful. The bidding: "It isn't enough to bid your North hand," he replied coldly. "You have got to bid your hand as high as his actual holding
