**BLACKWOOD on BRIDGE**

**Even With Poor Hand Aid Partner To Defend**

When your opponents stop at a 10-trick game and you have only one defensive trick, it is reasonable to assume that your partner has some defensive strength. Otherwise the opponents probably would have bid, or at least tested out, a slam contract.

It follows, then, that you should play your cards in a manner best calculated to help partner defend correctly. This applies no matter how small and apparently worthless your own cards are.

In today's deal Mr. Masters' hand was too strong for a response of one no trump or two spades and not quite strong enough for a jump to two no trump or three spades. Accordingly, he marked time with a bid of two clubs. His subsequent raise of the spade rebid urged Mr. Dale into a game.

Mr. Champion led the queen of hearts, dummy ducked and Mr. Muzzy played the eight. The jack of hearts followed and it also won. Mr. Muzzy won a third heart lead with the ace. He returned a trump.

Mr. Dale won and saw only nine winners. He returned a trump, hoping someone would discard incorrectly. Someone did. But there was a good reason for it.

On the run of the spades Mr. Champion signalled with the eight of diamonds, then with the eight of clubs. Mr. Muzzy played clubs and diamonds at random and showed little interest in the whole proceedings.

When Mr. Champion finally had to get down to three cards, he held a doubleton king in both minors. He took a coin from his pocket and flipped it. When it came up heads, he blanked his king of diamonds. Mr. Dale then cashed the ace of the suit and dummy's queen, too, the game-going trick.

Mr. Muzzy's last four cards were the jack-nine of diamonds and the jack-10 of clubs. Mr.

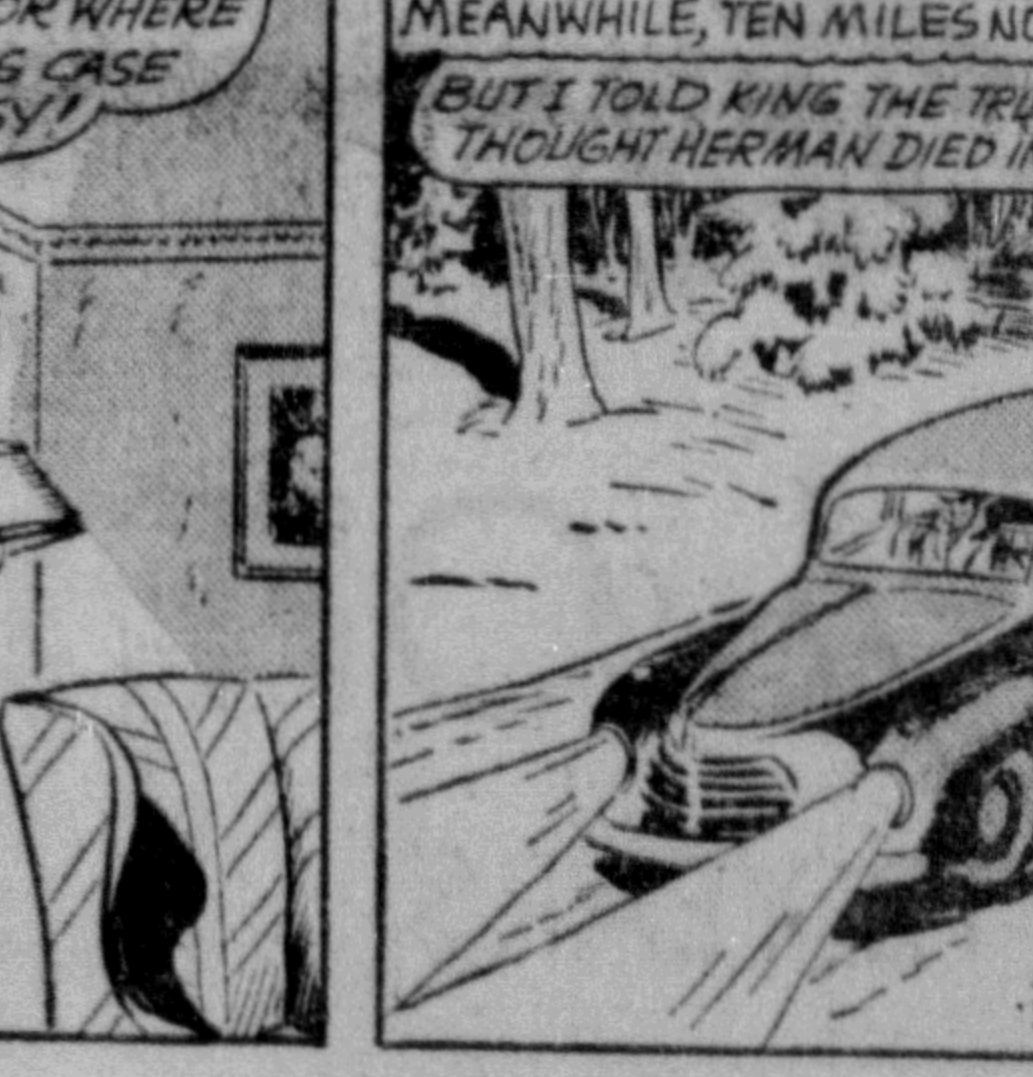

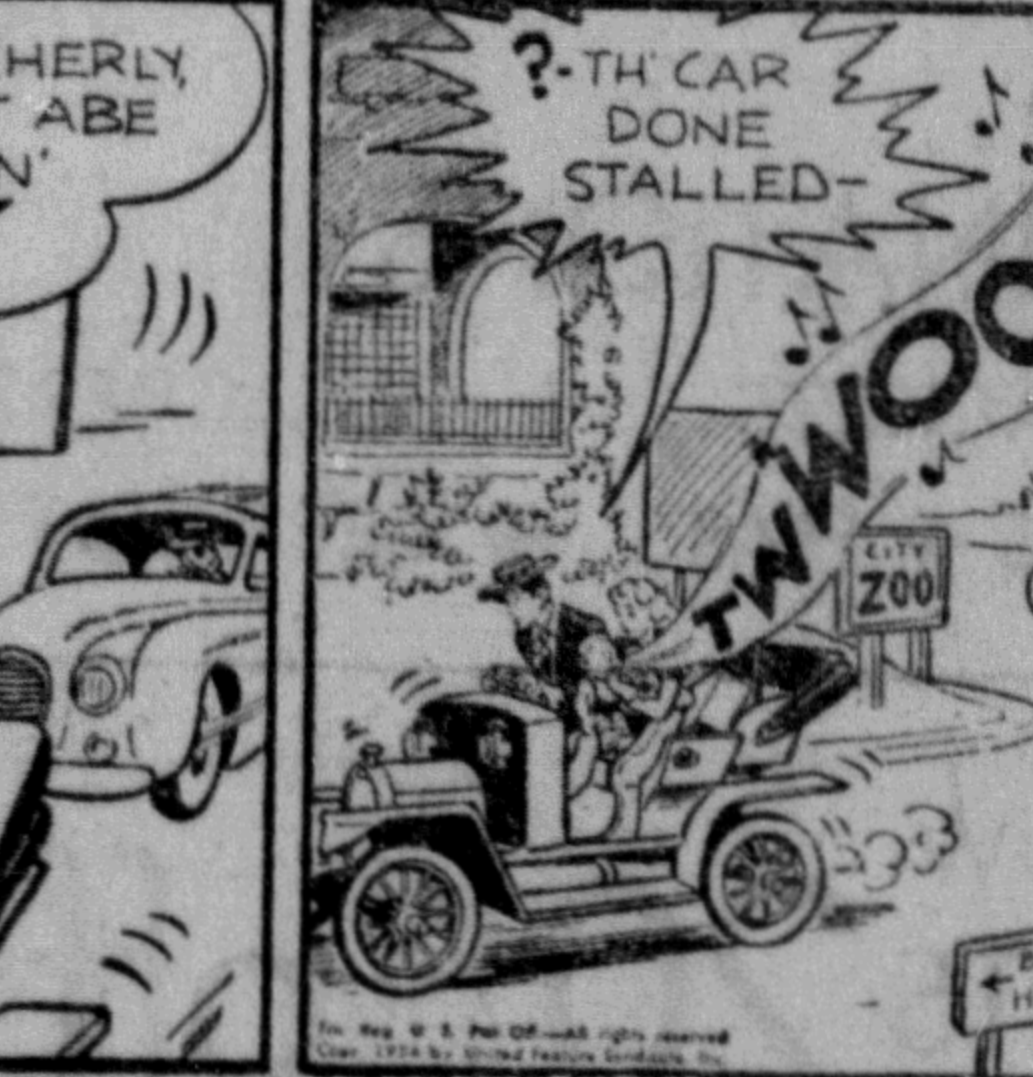
