

Skullduggery at Polls Gets Tougher Following Adoption of 'Wylie Fold'

OTTAWA (CP)—Skullduggery at the polls is getting tougher all the time.

Safeguards against beating the election laws have been building up for many years, and the odd new barrier will be set up in the election, Aug. 10.

The existing system is regarded as virtually unbeatable, either by voters or by candidates and their supporters. The form of the ballot, and the way it is handled, are part of a scheme designed to block any form of manipulation.

The ballot, which comes in book form, is made up of three parts: A stub, a counterfoil and the ballot proper with the names of the candidates. Each ballot has to be initiated by the deputy returning officer in a poll.

VOTING PROCEDURE

When the elector comes in to vote, the DRO rips from the book and hands him the ballot with counterfoil attached. After the ballot is marked, the DRO, before dropping it into the box, checks his initial on the back of the sheet and makes sure the number on the counterfoil tallies with that on the stub.

The identifying counterfoil is

turned off before the ballot goes into the box.

Scrutineers for all opposing parties in each poll double-check these precautions.

Since the last election, a new twist in ballot-handling has been put into effect by Parliament, aimed at cutting down the chance of a poll official taking a peek at how a particular person voted.

THE "WYLIE FOLD"

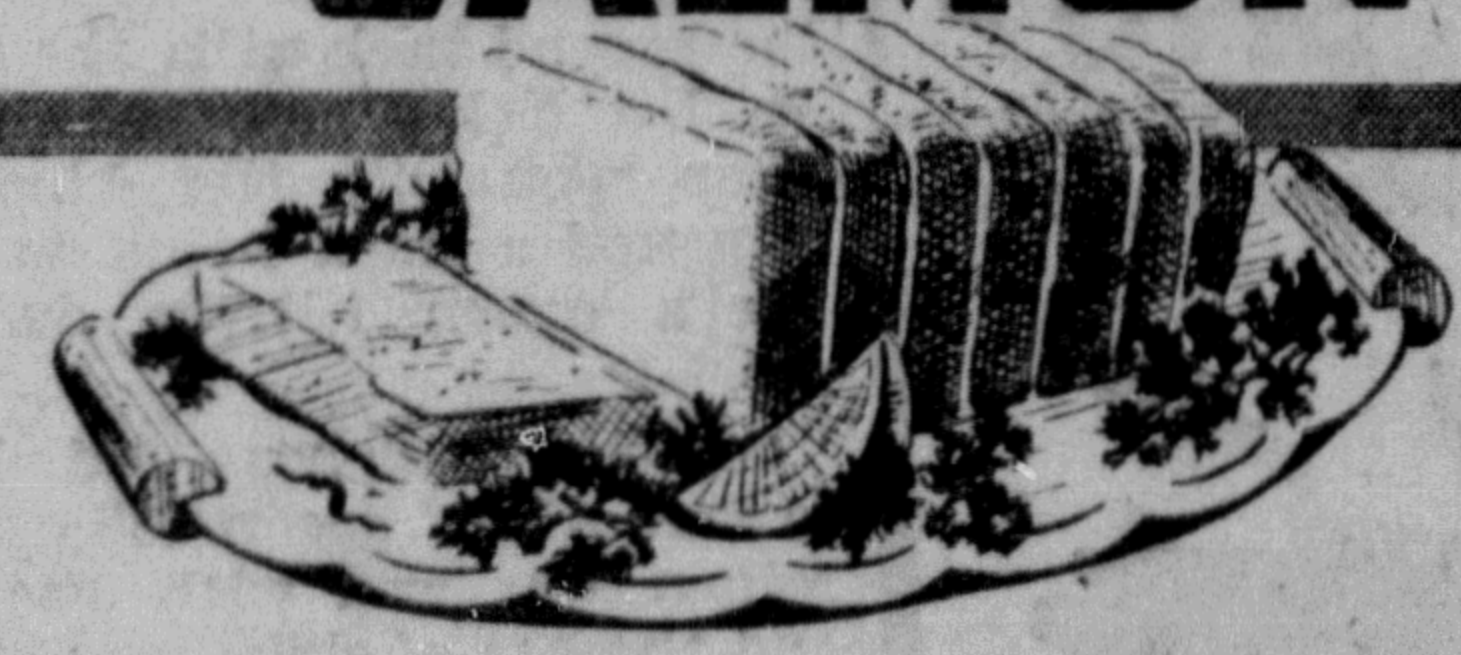
Ballots handed to the elector have to be folded in a certain way by the DRO and refolded by the voter before being given back to be put in the box. William Wylie, Social Credit member of the Commons for Medicine Hat, convinced the House elections committee in 1951 the fold left a chance for a quick look at how an elector voted and proposed a new one.

The "Wylie fold" was adopted by Parliament and now is official.

Psychiatrist Says Christie Fascinated by Dead Bodies

LONDON (CP)—A psychiatrist said Wednesday that John Reginald Christie—who admits killing seven women in a grisly sex-murder drama rivaling the exploits of Jack the Ripper—was under-sexed and "fascinated" by dead bodies.

Dr. J. A. Hobson told a tense and packed Old Bailey courtroom Christie was more indignant when testimony placed him inside a tavern than he was at evidence of the gruesome slayings.

Dr. Hobson was called to buttress the defence contention that Christie was insane when he committed the murders with strangling cord and gas tube. He said Christie's fascination with corpses started when, as a boy, he saw the dead body of his grandfather.

Hobson followed Christie in the witness box after the lean-faced defendant told the jury there was "no reason, no sense" in the slayings.

Christie's lawyer described him as "mad as a March hare when he kills people."

Nervously working his long fingers, Christie haltingly admitted garrotting three more women, a total of seven so far, as his murder trial progressed through its third day at Old Bailey court. Tuesday he admitted killing his wife and three other women.

Christie told defence counsel Sir Lionel Head that he put his wife's body under the floorboards "because I did not want to be separated from her and lose her—that is why I still had her in the house."

Tuesday, Christie wept as he told the court he strangled his wife with a stocking because he could not stand seeing her suffer from a convulsion.

Police found the wife's body lying close to a small grating
