Unusual Play Turns Out To Be a Wise Precaution

It isn't often you have to duck the first lead in a suit where your have three sure stoppers. This unusual play was made in today's hand and the kibitzers considered it an extreme (and probably unnecessary) precaution. Actually, it was based on sound and quite simple reasoning.

Mr. Abel led the jack of spades and, to his surprise, it held. Here was Mr. Masters' reasoning in ducking the trick. First he couldn't hope to win more than three spades. To make his contract, he would have to bring in at least two club tricks.

Now, if the opposing spades were divided 4-3, only one spade need be lost and the contract was probably safe. However, if Mr. Abel had five spades, it might be vital to wait until Mrs. Keen was out of that suit before surrendering the lead to

her in clubs.

The chances were good that the three high club honors were split between the defenders and that Mrs. Keen could get on lead at least once.

This thoughtful planning paid off handsomely. Mr. Abel can hardly be criticized for continuing spades and Mr. Masters won the second trick with the queen. He led a low club which Mrs. Keen won with the king. She returned a small heart and Mr. Abel's queen fell to dummy's ace.

Another club was led, losing to Mr. Abel's queen. The spade return was won with the king and the ace of clubs was knocked out. Mr. Masters still had a spade stopper and the contract was on ice.

Note that if Mr. Masters had won the first spade trick he would have gone set. On gaining the lead with the king of clubs, Mrs. Keen would have led back a spade knocking out the second stopper. Now Mr. Abel, with two more club tricks and only one more high spade to knock out, would have been one jump ahead of Mr. Masters at all times.
