Military Secrets Revealed

WASHINGTON (AP) -Somebody's security slip was showing today with publication of recent testimony about United States military secrets by army officials before a congressional committee.

Military secrets which popped into the open included information about:

A new weapons-carrying vehicle, nicknamed "The Thing but carrying the official designation "ontos," to be used variously, including as a mount for a new "very high-powered" recoilless rifle and for a quadruple 50-calibre anti-aircraft weapon against low-flying

A plan to provide "much longer range" for the 280-millimetre cannon, which now has a 20-mile accurate range and fires_either atomic or conventional shells, and a new shell, slightly smaller than the calibre of this giant cannon, expected to extend its range "by about 50 per cent."

• "Extra light tanks." two of which are under test, of a type expected eventually to replace the 28-ton Walker bulldog tank

The trend has speeded steady growen of a system of hostels offering inexpensive beds and

Since the first hostel appearthey have sprung up hroughout the United Kingdom within easy travelling distance of each other. The Youth Hostels Association, whose name belies the diversity of individual membership ages, now has more than 420 hostels and a membership exceeding 245,000.

Three-fifths of the association members are under 21 and another fifth are under 30. The remainder run from five to 80. Diversity in the type of traveller is even wider, ranging from holidaying students and professors to typists, laborers and other elements.


Hostel amenities are rough and ready, but adequate.

For from six to seven shillings, hikers, bicyclists or canoeists get a bed for the night, two solid plain meals and a packed lunch Prices are cheaper for younger

No one is allowed entrance before 5 p.m. Lights go out at 10:30 p.m., residents must clean, dust and cook and smoking isn't allowed in the sleeping quarters.

The hostels themselves are as varied as their occupants and the U.K. total includes converted mills and former manor houses.
