LE HAVRE, France (CP)—Firemen dashed to the waterfront at this channel port today after fire broke out aboard the 49,850-ton French liner Liberte.
 The blaze, described as "inconsequential," was extinguished quickly.
 The fire broke out in the storeroom as the liner, one of the prides of the French Line's passenger service to North America, was alongside the dock.
 The Liberte before the Second World War was the German liner Europa. France got her as war reparations.

BLACKWOOD on BRIDGE

 Deceptive Play Hides Weakness in Suit

If you have a Mr. Heinsite in your bridge crowd (and, unfortunately, most of us do), you know that it is very discouraging to play with him as a partner.
 He is practically oblivious to strategy, tactics, humanics and fine plays of all kinds. No matter how well you play, he can always think up something you could have done better.
 In today's deal he opened the four of hearts against Mr. Dale's three no trump contract. The old master decided that to lay off would only point up his weakness in the suit. He could see that it was impossible to win nine tricks unless he got one diamond, and that meant letting the enemy in.
 He therefore made a nice strategic move, promptly winning the first trick with the ace of hearts and laying down the jack of diamonds.
 Now Mr. Heinsite couldn't possibly know for sure that the hearts were all good. From Mr. Dale's play at trick one it seemed more likely that the old boy had started with something like ace, jack, small in the suit. And the diamond play at trick two looked like a finesse was coming up. Cunningly, Mr. Heinsite played low—and the jack of diamonds held.
 Mr. Dale then lost no time in running off three spades and four clubs for his aim.
 "Well," said Mr. Champion accusingly, "I am waiting to see who you are going to criticize on the defense of this hand."
 What do you think Mr. Heinsite's comment was? Would he point out that a contract of five clubs was cold on the North-South cards? Would he dig up some fancied justification for not going up with the ace of diamonds at trick two? Would he compliment Mr. Dale on his excellent deceptive play?
 "No, none of these. Instead, he named every card in Mr. Dale's hand. 'Am I right?'" he asked. "Was that the hand you started with?"
 "You've named every card exactly," Mr. Dale replied.
 "Then your first bid," said Mr. Heinsite, "should have been three no trump, not two."
