Pro-Cons Would Ban Communists
VICTORIA — Hon. George Drew, Progressive Conservative leader, says the Liberal government is incapable of dealing with the Canadian housing problem, because the number of houses completed in Canada was smaller last year than in 1950.

Mr. Drew, in an election campaign speech delivered Monday night before he left for Vancouver, also accused the Liberals of sitting back while Communists burrowed into vital industry.
He said a Progressive Conservative government would ban Communist activities under the Criminal Code because present Canadian laws had no way of dealing with Communists until they had committed sabotage.
The Liberal government took "arbitrary action" against employing some persons on Communist grounds while making no attempt to define communism under law, and at the same time employed "those of well-known Communist record in other agencies of the same government."

"The extent to which Communist organizers have established themselves in plants taking any part in the production of uranium or other atomic products suggests that the time for action in this country is long overdue."

Stars Within Half Game Of Rainiers

Los Angeles jumped Seattle, 6-4, and Hollywood overcame Sacramento 9-2.

Oakland had a four-run seventh inning that overcame Portland, 4-3. This game, played at Portland, was delayed 42 minutes by a defective circuit in the park lighting system.

Southpaw Al Lien of San Francisco was pretty much the whole show as the Seals whipped San Diego 3-1, in an afternoon game.

Doris Hart Reaches Finals
WIMBLEDON (CP)—Doris Hart and Maureen Connolly advanced to the final round of women's singles in the All-England lawn tennis championships today.

Miss Hart defeated Mrs. Dorothy Head Knole 6-2, 6-2, and Miss Connolly disposed to Shirley Fry, 6-1, 6-1 in the all-American semi-finals.

George Fazio of Los Angeles won the Canadian open golf title in a tense finish at Beaconfield, Que., seven years ago today. Fazio tied Dick Metz of Kansas with 278 in the regulation 72 holes, and in the 18-hole playoff Fazio won by a single stroke at the 18th hole.
