She also defeated her rival woman speed aviator, Jacqueline Auriol of France, who previously had wrested the women's speed record from Miss Cochran.

Murder Sentence Reduced

VANCOUVER (CP) - Court of Appeals has reduced to manslaughter the verdict against Glen Donald Smith, 22-yearold army deserter who had been sentenced to be hanged for

murder in Whitehorse, Y.T. The appeal court sentenced Smith to 15 years in penitentiary in the case arising from the shooting death of Ralph Caruso, Whitehorse taxi driver, last Aug. 11.

Defence counsel was Mayor John M. Cuelenaere of Prince grounds for appeal for Smith, except the application for reduction of the charge to manslaughter. He pleaded for a sentence of from seven to 10 years on the ground that Smith had no criminal record.

Chief Justice Gordon Sloan said Smith's sentence will be subject to review from time to time and he may be released before the end of his sentence if his conduct warrants it.




