**Sockeye Commission Director Recommends Shorter Season**

BELLINGHAM, Wash. (AP) - A 96-hour-a-week closed period from Aug. 1 to Sept. 6 in the Fraser River area was recommended Friday to the International Pacific Sockeye Fisheries Commission.  
 Commission Director Lloyd Royal told the group at its meeting here that the season should be shortened to three days a week to insure adequate escapement. He said increased efficiency of nylon gillnets in the Fraser should be offset.  
 Royal also recommended 48-hour weekly closures in United States waters from June 25 to Sept. 6 and 48 hours weekly on the high seas from June 25 to Aug. 31.  
 The director's recommendations customarily are accepted by the commission. Chairman Tom Reid of Surrey, B.C., said the group will meet today to consider the dates suggested and will announce its findings Monday.  
 The commission predicted a light run in July but said a heavier run could be expected during the peak season of Aug. 20-Sept. 1. It said the catch probably would be substantially heavier than the parent 1950 cycle when 2,500,000 sockeye were taken by U.S. and Canadian fishermen.  
 Nick Mladinich, Tacoma, representing the U.S. purse seiners,

objected to the early opening for American fishing, saying there was no reason to expect any sockeye before July 1.  
 Another objection was raised by Richard Nelson, Vancouver, representing Canadian packers. He said the Canadians felt it was not fair for the commission to count sockeye caught in the Fraser River after Oct. 2 in dividing the catch between the industries of the two nations.  
 Nelson said the October sockeye were of lower quality and fishing them was not economically as profitable as the earlier runs. An Anacortes packer, John Planch, objected, however, to any change in the method of dividing the catch equally.

**Toronto Man Ruled Owner Of Mine Claim**

JUNEAU, Alaska (AP) - Federal Judge George Foltz has ruled that E. Miles Flynn, Toronto mining man, is the legal holder of nickel mine claims on Yakobi Island, 90 miles west of Juneau.  
 Flynn had sued S. H. P. Vevelstad and the Aurora Nickel Co. to quit title to the property. Vevelstad had in turn accused Flynn of claim jumping and sued for \$20,000,000 in damages.  
 The decision naming Flynn as the proper claims holder may pave the way for development of long-known nickel deposits on the island.  
 John R. Stirett, Toronto lawyer associated with Mr. Flynn in the holdings, said immediate development is planned "as soon as the title is quieted".  
 He said that at present the island is under 12 feet of snow and is uninhabited except by Kodiak bears.

**Foreign Trade Shows Deficit**

OTTAWA (CP) Canada's 1953 foreign trade showed a deficit of \$210,200,000, largest in history.  
 In a final survey, the bureau of statistics estimates exports at \$4,172,600,000, second highest in history, and just below the peak of \$4,356,000,000 in 1952.  
 Imports were estimated at a new high of \$4,382,800,000, up from \$4,030,500,000 in 1952.  
 The peak deficit compared with the previous high of \$128,000,000 in 1930. However, in that year, trade in both exports and imports totalled only \$1,900,000,000, compared to an all-time high of \$8,550,000,000 in 1953.
