Refining May Not Be Necessary For Uranium Found in Australia

ADELAIDE, Australia (CP) — Mining experts claim that pitchblende found at Wild Dog Valley, only 40 miles from this South Australian state capital, represents the first discovery in

Australia of the richest form of uranium ore.

Geologists define the deposit as a massive resinous-looking pitchblende.

According to mines director S. B. Dickenson of South Aus-

tralia, lumps of the ore contain 76 per cent or more of uranium oxide.

The pitchblende at Rum Jungle, Australia's major uranium field in the Northern Territory, is not in the massive form, but is finely disseminated through black slate.

EASILY REFINED

The advantage of the newly-discovered ore lies in the readiness with which it can be refined to uranium oxide. Sir Douglas Mawson, one of Australia's top geologists, believes that if the deposits prove extensive, some of the ore may be capable of export without any refining.

A large refinery is under construction at Port Pirie, in South Australia, to handle the ore from another established state field at Uranium Hill. Sharts soon will be sunk at Wild Dog Valley in an effort to locate a pitchblende ledge. If it is found a uranium mine will be established there.

Meanwhile, the South Australian government has awarded £5,000 to the two brothers, W. F. and J. J. Wenham, who found the deposit, and has reserved mineral rights over a large part of the area.

Atomic experts say that Australia, although she has achieved world status as a uranium source, cannot hope for her own power supply from atomic energy for at least 10 years.

ACTION PLANNED

Assistant Defence Secretary John A. Hannah said the defence department has planned for some time to take action against returned war prisoners when their action justified it.

Dickenson first decided, under the Korean armistice arrangements, to remain with the Communists, then changed his mind and came home.

Other authorities give credit to Menzies, saying he discovered the tree in 1791 on Vancouver Island.

Lyon says Menzies did file his report first, in 1804. He claims Douglas, although filing his report in 1805, actually made the first discovery.

Army Officer Threatened As Former Prisoner Charged

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Cpl. Edward S. Dickenson, the former prisoner-of-war who changed his mind about remaining with the Communists and then was charged with unlawfully dealing with the enemy, is described by one of his lawyers as "quite a sick man."

Li.-Col. Edward W. Hendrick said Sunday night the 23-year-old soldier from Crackers Neck, Va., is "obviously run down and nervous" and was very much surprised and shocked when these charges were read to him Friday night.

An inquiry will determine whether the returned POW must face court-martial trial.

The case meanwhile continued to have repercussions both inside and out of the defense department.

TO CARRY GUN

CABINET STUDYING PLAN TO RAISE JUDGES' PAY

OTTAWA (CP) — The cabinet is studying a plan for a 5 per cent increase in salaries of judges of provincial supreme courts and county courts, it was learned here.

This would raise the annual pay of provincial supreme court justices to \$18,000 from \$14,000 and of county court judges to \$10,000 from \$8,000. Provincial chief justices would be increased to \$20,000 from \$16,000.
