





and if heat resistance is used it sand with fine sandpaper or fine will not mark. Three coats are steel wool. Clean with solvent after sanding. Apply a filler which has been thinned out to varnish consistency, allow it to dry until gummy, then wipe off the excess filler and allow the to dry, Sandpaper again.

USE STAINS

Use several thin coats of stain achieve the desired color rather than one thick coat. Allow to dry completely before applying varnish.

Apply the varnish with long, even strokes and brush in enough to get a smooth coat with no bubbles. Start in the centre and work to the edges

Brush the varnished surface with fine steel wool or sandpaper to remove the high gloss and roughness but use care to avoid scratching the surface. Wash well with solvent and dry Apply two more coats of varnish sandpapering and washing between the second and third

The final coat should be rubbed with powdered pumice and oil and then cleaned well. Polish with wax or a good grade of furniture polish.




