#### Blunders Set Stage for Squeeze Play

In books, the hands which illustrate squeeze plays are set up so that there is nothing the defenders can do about it. In actual play, however, a squeeze often develops as the play goes along and after a blunder or series of blunders by the defenders.

It may not be fair to charge Mr. Muzzy or Mr. Abel with outright errors in the defense of today's hand. Let's say they just made unfortunate choices of leads.

If a club had been led by the defense at any time, a squeeze play would not have been possible. But Mr. Muzzy's opening lead was a spade and Mr. Abel's nine spot forced the ace.

ible folly of France—aided and abetted in this case by Britain and U.S.A.—is driving all Asia and Africa into the political arms of Russia.

I travelled through much of that part of the world last year and everywhere I went I found the same story. Up till now there are no strong Communist parties operating above ground. Even the underground Communist parties are of small account, to date. But the political climate in all those countries is "made to order" for Communism to sweep in like a prairie fire, once it gets a start.

FRANCE'S folly in Africa is the more incredible since she seems to have learned nothing from the tragedy in Indo-China. Immediately after the Second World War it would have been possible to settle the Indo-China. They (the French Communists) expected to come to power in France in the near future and they wanted to retain Indo-China under the direct control of France in order to have a ready made base of operations in Asia. They were caught in their own trickery.

APPALLING as is France's folly in regard to African home rule movements—the short sightedness of the U.S.A. seems even more incredible. There was a time when every American actually believed the great words at the start of the Declaration of Independence.
