WORK (AP)—Women on the best-dressed list have a mixed reaction to Christian Dior's shortened hemline, an initial survey reveals.
 At fashionable spas and summer homes on both sides of the Atlantic, some of them express pleasure at the prospect of change. Others differ. Some comments: "The Duchess of Windsor in her personal taste is an intermediate length. Too long nor too short.  The Duchess of Kent's private secretary told reporters: "Even if the Duchess had views on skirts she would not express them."

Baby Bonus Payments Show Increase

VICTORIA—Federal welfare payments in British Columbia during July continued to show an increase. In both Family Allowances and Old Age Security. They totalled \$5,420,711.00. Of this amount, \$2,144,701.00 in Family Allowances were paid on behalf of 355,804 children in 176,393 families.
 Old Age Security cheques aggregating \$3,276,010 went to 81,409 pensioners.
 During the month, 461 families receiving allowances entered British Columbia from other provinces while 400 families left. The movement among Old Age Security pensioners was: in 119, out 107.
