QUESNEL, B.C. (C)—RCMP said
Monday they are holding a Van-
couver truck driver following a
traffic accident which took the
life of a 13-year-old boy at Kers-
ley, 12 miles south of here.

Police said the victim, David
Portingell, and a companion,
Bevan Germaine, also 13, were on
a small bridge Sunday when the
truck approached.

The boys were running to get
off the bridge when Portingell
was struck and killed.

Police said the vehicle, a City
Construction Company truck,
continued south on the highway
for 1½ miles after the accident.
The name of the driver was with-
held pending further investiga-
tion.
