\$1 Million Fire Strikes Ontario Town, Kills Man

AURORA, Ont. (CP)—A \$1,000,000 fire, which cost one life, swept through four stores on this town's main street today, defying fire-fighting attempts for three hours.

Walter Ho, 40, a Canadian-born Chinese, was killed in an explosion which, firemen said, touched off the blaze in the town, 20 miles north of Toronto.

Ho was an employee of a restaurant in the block of 10 to 12 stores.

Swedish Plane Ends Polar Test Flight

STOCKHOLM (AP)—Scandinavian airlines' "Gorm Viking" Super-Cloudmaster landed 40 minutes ahead of schedule here early today, completing a 6,000-mile polar test flight across the top of the world from Los Angeles.

The four-engine DC6B left Los Angeles Friday and flew by way of Edmonton, Churchill, Frobisher Bay, N.W.T. and Greenland.

BLACKWOOD on BRIDGE

Overeager Player Plays Without Thought

Here's a new kind of bridge problem. It's not to make three no trump on the North-South cards. No, the problem is to figure how you can miss three no trump... It's not easy.

Of course the bidding, play and defense of every hand is influenced by what has gone before and this was no exception. On several previous deals Mr. Champion had given Mr. Muzzy a verbal lacing for failing to use the hold-up play. Failure to hold up had lost the contract in each case.

Finally in today's deal Mr. Muzzy was determined that he would suffer no more abuse for this reason. Mrs. Keen led the six of spades. Mr. Abel played the queen and Mr. Muzzy laid the trey firmly on the table.

Mr. Abel returned the nine which was covered with the jack and won by Mrs. Keen with the king. Another spade lead cleared the suit and since Mrs. Keen held the guarded king of clubs, she was bound to get in to cash two more spades and defeat the contract.

Of course Mr. Muzzy should have won the first trick with the ace of spades. At least three club tricks had to be won to make the contract and the club finesse had to be taken toward Mrs. Keen.

If she got in with the king of clubs she could not continue spades without setting up Mr. Muzzy's jack.

To give Mr. Muzzy all proper credit, he probably would have made the right play under normal conditions. But, owing to pressure from across the table, he was more confused than usual. In placing the blame for the error at trick one, don't overlook charging a sizeable portion to Mr. Champion.

Former PoWs Reach Taipei

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP)—Five shiploads of one-time soldiers in Red China's Korean armies arrived today to a tumultuous welcome from their chosen new homeland, Nationalist China.

Flag-waving, shouting crowds lined Taipei's streets as creeping trucks bore the 4,625 former war prisoners from the nearby port of Keelung where they landed from Korea.

TRAIL, B.C. (CP)—Clayton Walls, an organizer for the CIO International Woodworkers of America, said here the vote to end the woodworkers' strike in the Kootenays has "trick" snag.

Woodworkers throughout the southern interior are voting on a proposed agreement which would end the three-month-old strike. But, Mr. Walls said, the vote in the Kootenays has been held up by the IWA Cranbrook local while the status of workers at Creston is checked.

He said 26 Creston workers had been informed they had to return to work by Dec. 28 at Creston Sawmills Ltd. or they would be considered as having left the company. The men stayed on strike.
