Luck Plus Skill Can Equal Contract

He took out Mr. Abel's double of two hearts but when three hearts got doubled (in good, loud tones, incidentally) he couldn't resist the chance to hang a damaging set on Brash.

Mr. Abel might have five or even six hearts — and on an opening spade lead, Miss Brash would be forced in her trump suit at the very start. She had bid on extremely questionable values in several previous hands.

Then, considering the loudness of Mr. Abel's double and the fact that Mr. Champion had refused to let the two heart double stand, she decided to play all five outstanding hearts on her left.

Accordingly she led a fourth round of diamonds—and Mr. Abel couldn't decide what to do. Finally, he ruffed in with the jack of hearts and Miss Brash played the last spade from the board.

Mr. Champion frowned and muttered at his partner's play of the jack of hearts. He didn't think it could possibly be right. This seemed to unhorse Mr. Abel and he became more confused than before.

He cashed in his two high clubs and then, after some thought, made the very bad return of a
