## Baby Bonus Payments At New High

**VICTORIA** — Federal welfare payments in British Columbia in May reached an all-time high of \$5,351,930.

Of this amount, \$3,242,150 went to Old Age Security pensioners and \$2,109,780 to Family Allowances recipients, **W. R. Bone**, regional director, said today.

Old Age Security pensioners numbered 86,515, while Family Allowances were paid to 359,981 children in 174,748 families. During May, 112 Old Age Security pensioners moved to British Columbia from other provinces while 101 left. 533 families receiving Family Allowances left British Columbia and 421 entered this province. The bulk of the movement in both cases was to and from the prairie provinces.
