Make The Unexpected Move And Confuse Opponents

To become an expert at timing a hand properly as declarer, you have got to be willing to make plays which are just the opposite of the "normal" procedure.

See how Mr. Champion handled the four heart contract in today's deal. The nine of diamonds was opened, dummy and Mrs. Keen played low and the jack in the closed hand won.

After a few moments thought, Mr. Champion led the deuce of spades away from his king. Mr. Muzzy who was kibitzing, thought this was the silliest play he ever saw. He shrugged eloquently to indicate, in his opinion, Mr. Champion had lost his mind. With plenty of entries in dummy, why not lead up to the king of spades? Then, if the ace were in Mrs. Keen's hand, only one spade need be lost.

Of course Mr. Champion realized this. He would have liked to lead a spade up to his king. But he knew he could not afford that luxury. He would lose the timing on the hand.

As it was, Mrs. Keen won the second trick with the seven of spades and returned a diamond, which the ace won. The nine of spades was now led and Mrs. Keen won the queen. No return at this point would beat the contract.

Nothing could prevent Mr. Champion from ruffing a spade and he would lose only two spades and a club.

Note what would have happened if he had led a heart to dummy's ace at trick two. On the following lead up to the king of spades, Mr. Dale would win with the ace and return a trump. Mr. Dale could then win the next spade and fire another trump, taking the last heart off the board. Thus the defenders would be bound to win three spades and a club.

As Mr. Champion pointed out, Mr. Muzzy's play would make either five-odd or three-odd, depending on the location of the ace of spades. "The way I played it," he added, "I could make
