

### Ship Takes On Skeena Lumber

The first of a series of lumber shipments bound from Terrace to the United Kingdom is being loaded at the Canadian National Ocean Dock here, by the 10,000-ton SS Jersey City of the Anglo-Canadian Shipping Company, chartered by Terrace lumbermen.

About 675,000 board feet of lumber will be taken on by the Jersey City, from a total of 28 CN flat cars, bringing the shipment from Terrace. Most of the cars are here now, and it is expected the remainder will arrive by Wednesday night.

Loading is expected to be complete Thursday night, and the Jersey City, which arrived here at 3 p.m. Monday will load up with oil and sail Friday or Saturday for London, England.

The second shipment from the new lumbermen's organization, "Skeena Timber Products," is scheduled for early July.

### QCA Adds To Equipment

Queen Charlotte Airlines agent Jerry Levers today announced addition of a new three-passenger plane to the company's equipment here.

The four-place plane, a Cessna 180, was flown in here from Vancouver Thursday by Pilot Norm Jermyn.

Mr. Levers said the Cessna will be used mainly for charter work, allowing lower rates in comparison to those charged for the larger Norseman, used formerly on the airlines' charter work. The new plane is docked at QCA's Seal Cove base.

### Socred's Failure To Provide Aid for Fishermen Assailed

The Social Credit government's failure to provide workmen's compensation coverage for commercial fishermen was criticized by Frank Howard, CCF MLA for Skeena, in an address at a public meeting at Sandspit last week.

"This government," said Mr. Howard, "has stepped 40 years into the past by telling the fishermen that they should negotiate with the fishing companies for compensation coverage. The unfair principle was abolished in 1917, but has now been given new life by this reactionary government."

The CCF, he said, had consistently pressed for equity and justice in the matter, but, unfortunately for fishermen, their demands had fallen on deaf ears.

The mechanics for providing the coverage, he stressed, would be exceedingly simple, requiring only two small changes in the Compensation Act.

With regard to the remainder of the Compensation Act amendments, approved at the last session of the legislature, Mr. Howard said they had been generally acceptable to the opposition members.

### Bandits Rob Ferry Office Of \$9,700

WEST VANCOUVER (CP)—Two armed masked men held up the Black Ball ferry line office at Horseshoe Bay early today and escaped with estimated \$9,700.

The gunmen crashed a police block then took to the bush when their car struck a pole. Police have the area surrounded and a police dog is being used in an attempt to track down the bandits.
