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Alaska Ruling Renewed

WASHINGTON — The House Merchant Marine committee today approved the Senate-passed bill to renew for one year authority for Canadian ships to carry passengers between Haines and Skagway, Alaska, and other points in Alaska and foreign ports.

The legislation, first adopted in 1947, also permits Canadian ships to carry passengers and freight to or from Hyder, Alaska.
