
NEW WESTMINSTER ()-The Hudson's Bay Company's sturdy 3,-10n motorship Fort Hearne has loft New Westminster for a four-year stint in arctic waters.

The supply ship, overhauled and refitted here, will have travelled 4,500 miles in completing her trip this year to the remote shores of Cambridge Bay. It will be the second arctic tour for the vessel, built in Nova Scot,a in 1948.


She is under the command of Capt. Len Adey of Newfoundland and carries a crew of 11, including two Eskimos, a doctor and a

From her home port at Tuktoyyaktuk near the mouth of the Mackenzie river, the vessel will carry general cargo for company posts, church missions, department of transport signal and weather stations, RCMP and RCAF detachments, and other northern outposts.
