

Crippling Milk Drivers' Strike Ends In Toronto

TORONTO — Toronto milk panies and the five-day week drivers were back on their routes eliminating Wednesday deliveries today after the most serious milk strike in the city's history ended Sunday.

Most dairies said milk supplies were ample, although some, reported deliveries would be a few hours late because they were still waiting for milk to come in from the farms.

The 1,700 striking drivers and other workers, members of the Milk Drivers' Union (AFL-TLC), voted 413 to 341 Sunday to accept wage boosts offered by the com-

The strike lasted four days, during which farmers dumped thousands of gallons of milk into ditches. Police laid charges of assault against four milkmen.

Farmers lost an estimated \$320,000 in spoiled or dumped milk and strikers gained a wage boost of \$6.50 a week to bring weekly wages to about \$68.

The strike didn't change the price of milk to Toronto consumers.

HAGERSTOWN, Md. (AP) — Rioting prisoners smashed windows, furniture and equipment at the Maryland State Reformatory for males Sunday night in an uprising blamed on a baseball umpire's decision.

Superintendent Henry R. Raymond said a few inmates received minor cuts from window glass before the rebellion was crushed by guards and police manning fire hoses and tear-gas guns.

Bishop Goes On Trial Today In Warsaw Court

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — The former Roman Catholic Bishop of Kielce, Czeslaw Kaczmarek, three other Roman Catholic churchmen and a nun were scheduled to be tried today by the Warsaw regional military court on charges of spying for "American imperialists" and the Vatican.

The official announcement said the bishop was accused of organizing an espionage and diversionist centre in Kielce province, central Poland, of directing anti-state activities, of sabotag-

ing economic plans of the Communist government, conspiring to bring capitalism back to Poland and carrying on black market activities.

He also was accused of co-operating with the German occupation forces during the Second World War.

The bishop has been under frequent attack by the press for the last five years as an alleged German collaborator and a "reactionary."

Maritime Premiers Meet Today

MONCTON, N.B. (CP) — Premiers of the three Maritime provinces and a cabinet minister from Newfoundland meet here today to discuss mutual problems and possible solutions.

The meeting may lead to a new era of co-operation in the eastern provinces, known usually for their regional jealousies.

High on the agenda is a study of the economic position of the provinces.

Scientists Exploring Means Of Trapping Sun's Energy

Scientists are planning to explore the possibilities of chemically speeding springtime and delaying winter—as far as crops are concerned.

This was made known Sunday at a conference of some of the world's outstanding experts on solar energy. They seek ways and means to allow man to take better advantage of sunshine energy already available to agriculture—and also to tap a virtually wasted bounty of solar radiation as a means of supplying more heat and power for homes and industry.

The idea of the "crop season extension" is to hasten the planting season a few weeks by spreading chemicals on the snow or frost to promote melting, and to promote the growing season by absorbing enough solar energy to delay Jack Frost's attack on another couple of weeks.

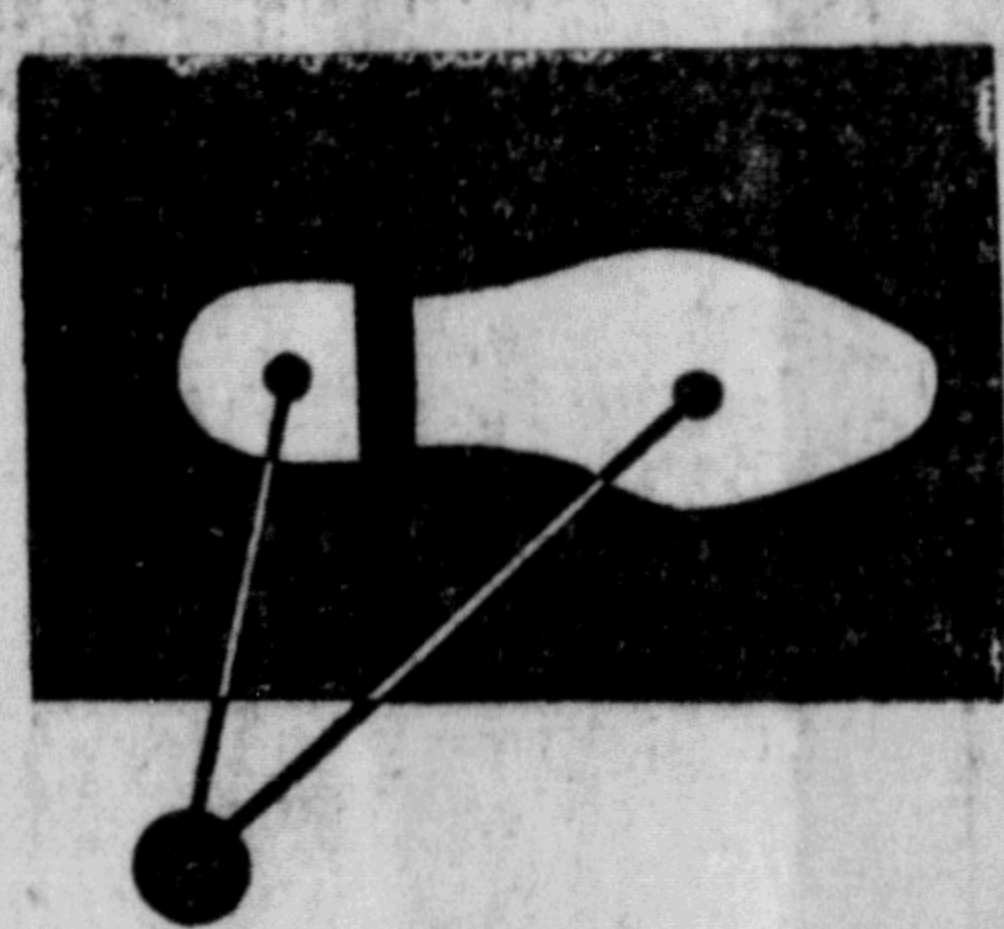
