Paper Scores Canadian Visit Of Clergymen

LONDON (Reuters)—An editorial in today's Daily Express opposed the idea of Canadian contributions to the cost of building a new cathedral for Coventry in Britain.
 "Two clergymen of the Church of England are on tour in Canada. They are the Rt. Rev. Richard Howard, provost of Coventry Cathedral, and the Rev. Clifford Ross, personal chaplain to the Lord Bishop of Coventry," the paper said.
 "They have with them an architect, Mr. Basil Spence, and a model for his proposed new cathedral for Coventry. And they have their caps in their hands. They go a-begging for 100,000 sterling.
 "It is a sorry thing to see these mendicant priests wandering around trying to talk Canadians into providing funds for an English church," this newspaper commented.
 "If the people of England are deeply moved by their religion they will build their own churches..."

Weather Hits Small Loggers

VANCOUVER—British Columbia's fire-free summer, which tripled the province's timber cut, is forcing small lumber operations to the wall, spokesmen for the industry said Saturday.
 "Larger operators, with both lumber camps and sawmills, are closing down some of their camps," one logging official said.
 "They find it cheaper to buy logs already in the water than to cut their own. Some of the smaller firms need money badly and are selling their cut on the 'distress' market."
