# Priests Christmas

Rev. Henri Tardy, 33, are none the worse for the 21 days they and four Eskimos spent drifting waters last August.

The priests sailed back to Holman Island at the end of September and returned to the duties of their mission in this settlement on the southwest coast of Victoria island, a vast barren island, 1,200 miles north of Edmonton.

#### TEND MIND, SPIRIT

They operate a school for Eskimo children and tend the spiritual needs of nomad Eskimo bands. The priests take turns making five-to six-week trips from the mission. They catch up with one Eskimo group, spend a little time, then move on to another group.

The priests make a point of being in the settlement for such religious feasts as Easter, New Year's Day and Christmas.
