viously assented to the said motion, revised their opinions apparently on the grounds that only hydro development was practical. Their attitude may or may not have been based on information received from the B.C. Power Commission, but it is interesting to note that recently the power commission has, following failure of the Whatshan hydro plant in the North Okanagan, definitely committed the commission to a large diesel generating installation in the city of Kamloops and this installation is being rushed to completion at the present time. In other words, the commission is now following exactly the procedure of the Northern B.C. Power Co. in making certain that an adequate auxiliary plant is available in time of emergency.  
The company finally received the consent of the Public Utilities Commission for an extension to its existing diesel plant and this extra capacity is now available.  
I cannot understand why Alderman Casey should vote one way, and then talk another.

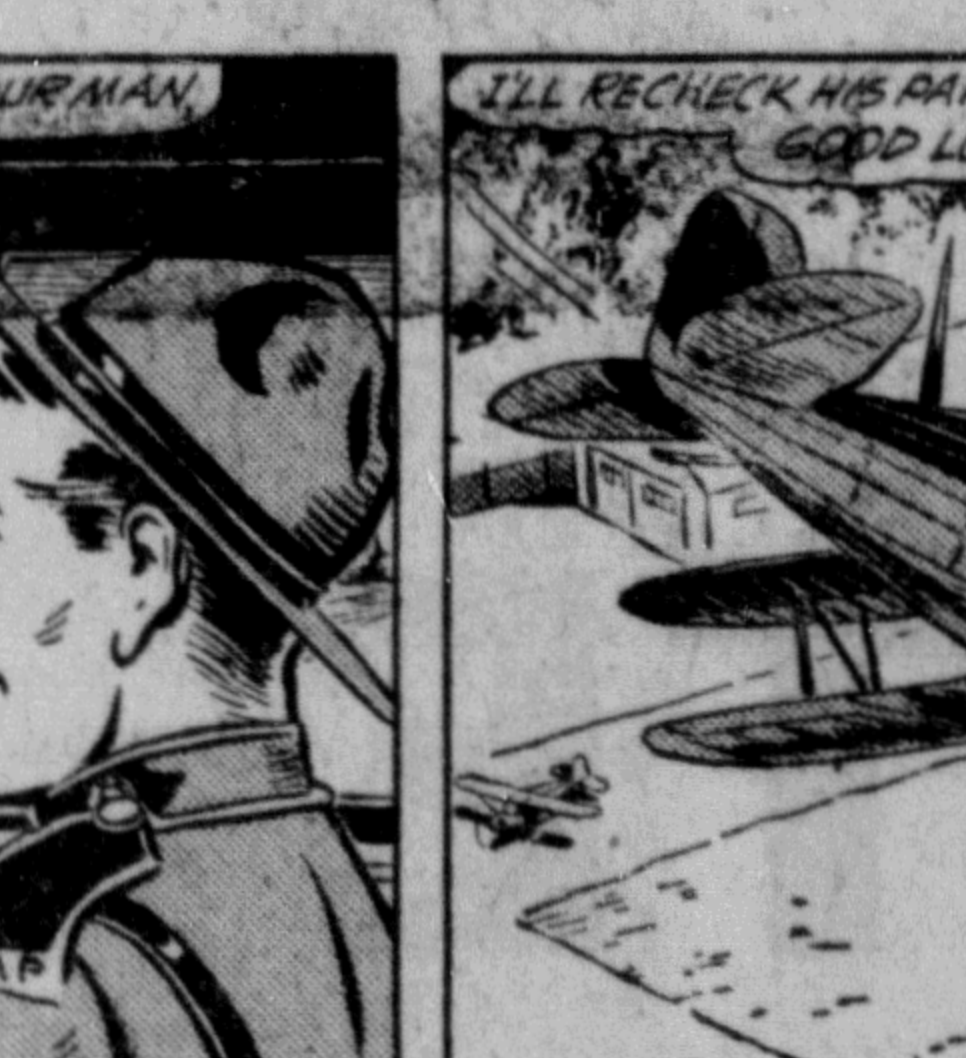

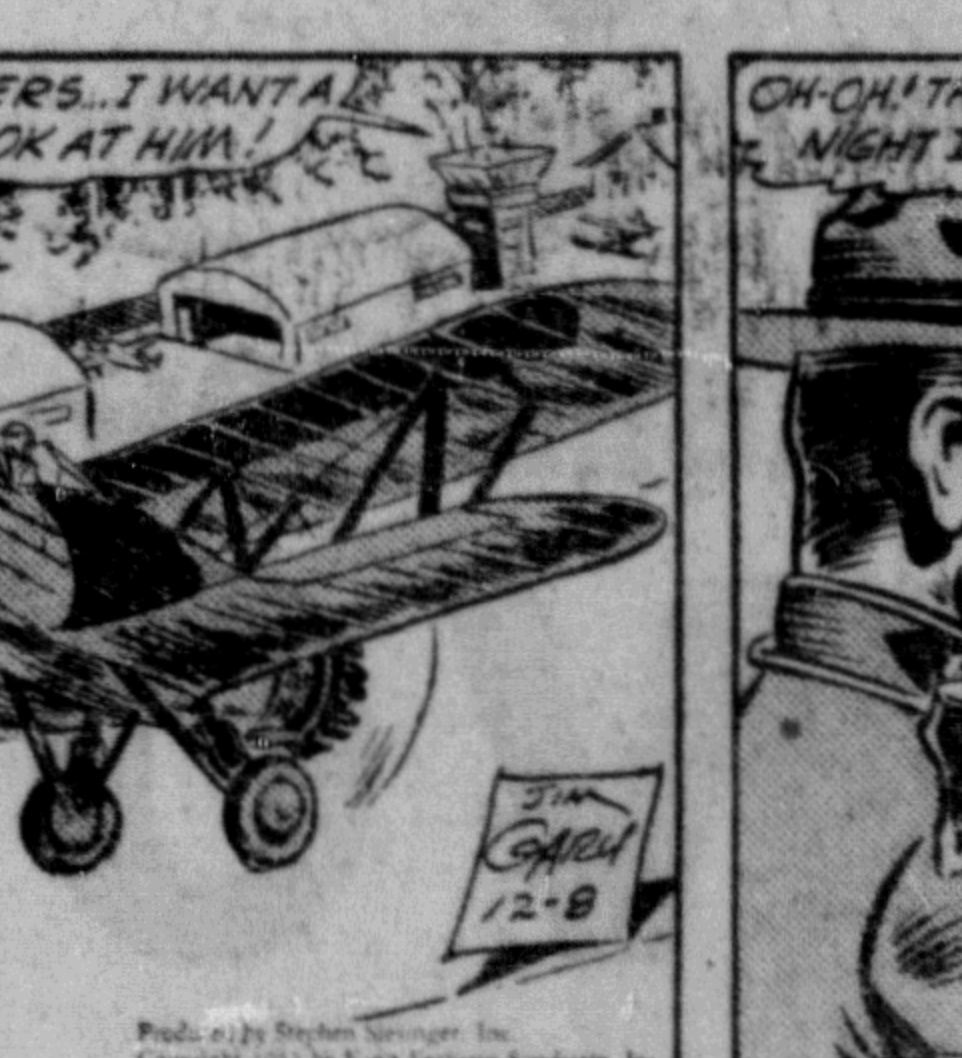

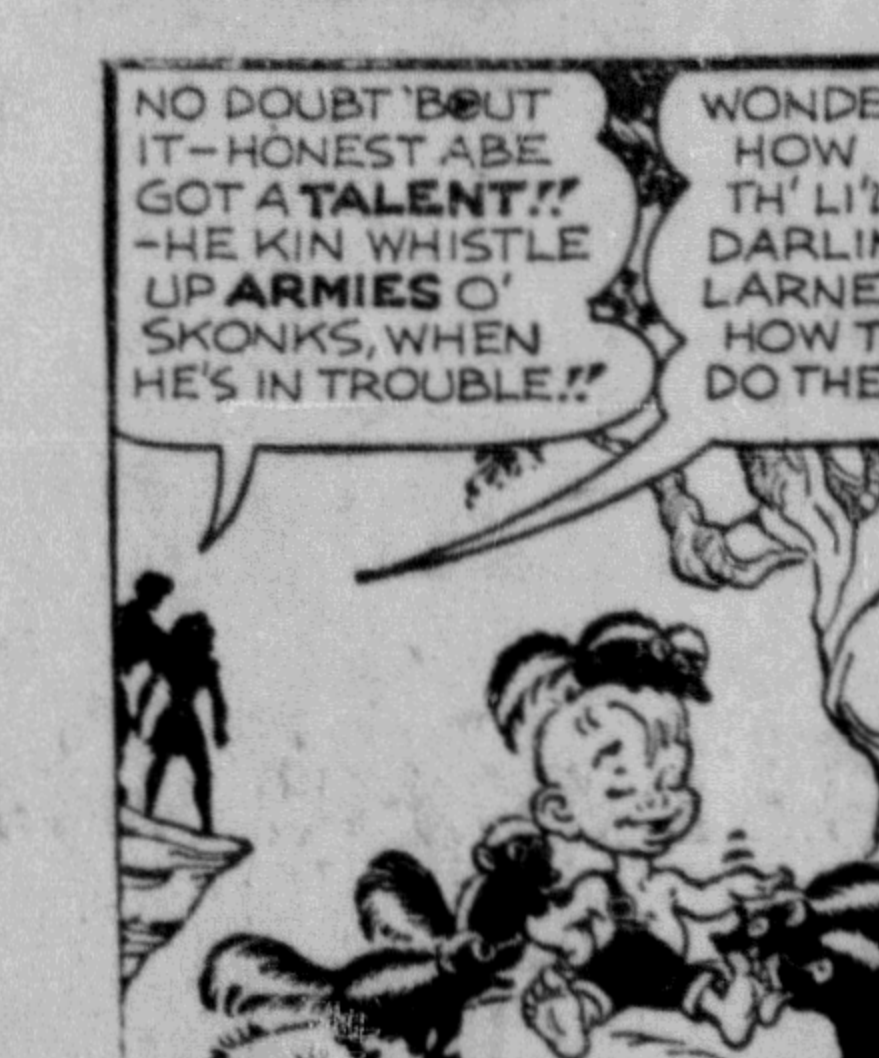
