Miss Brash's Optimism Pays Off

In her usual optimistic style Miss Brash landed in a six diamond contract after a substantial opening bid. If her opponents had led spades at every opportunity she would have had a hard time. But they never led spades at all.

Mr. Dale opened the jack of clubs. Dummy played low and Mrs. Keen won with the king and returned the suit. Winning the second trick with dummy's ace of clubs, Miss Brash pulled out the king of hearts. If Mrs. Keen had played the ace it would have been all over.

Miss Brash could have ruffed and later thrown her losing spade on the queen of hearts. But Mrs. Keen played the deuce of hearts. Miss Brash then went into a huddle. As the British say, she had to take a view.

Finally she made the right guess and decided to play Mr. Dale for the ace. She figured that if he held as many as four spades, plus the ace of hearts, the hand could be made on a squeeze. In other words, if Mr. Dale had four or more spades, he alone could guard that suit.

To guard both major suits, he would have to hold on to one heart and three spades—four cards in all. Could Miss Brash get him down to three cards? Tricks in clubs had been played. Trumping the king of hearts made three tricks played. Cashing the queen of clubs and ruffing a club in

"Today, head-hunting is done only in isolated places and is strictly banned by the government."

Expert on the aborigines' other customs is Johnny Wu, now employed by the Chinese-American council for rural rehabilitation. Wu, whose friend Huang Tseh-yung is a student at the University of Toronto, was interpreter for one year with a medical mission to the natives.

He says most of the seven tribes never marry within themselves but capture women from the other bands. Women have the right to divorce their husbands, though in the Orient it is usually the other way around. And names, translated, are like "War," "Hunting" and "Forest" for men and "Kiss," "Clouds," "Rain" and "Water Jar" for women.

The aborigines have their own dress, but the Formosans, who hundreds of years ago emigrated from China's Fukien province, now wear western-style clothes made from cotton worsted. The more recent Nationalist influx from the mainland hasn't affected Formosan styles, but the mainland women themselves still retain their Chinese fashions.
