We Will Miss Alan Hurst

IT IS hard to believe and still more difficult to accept that the tall, energetic figure of Alan Hurst will be among us no longer.

This able school principal who died with such shocking suddenness Thursday night was a man whose vigor and force of personality carried him directly to the foreground of our community life.

Incisive of mind and friendly of manner, he was beyond question a leader. He led the Booth Memorial High School to new levels of accomplishment and development and, driven by his interest in all things, continued to enlarge his scope until many other projects felt the stimulus and enthusiasm which were in his power to impart. The Civic Centre, Chamber of Commerce, Gyro Club, Canadian Legion were some of the organizations which knew and appreciated the magic quality of his influence. In the field of sport his leadership was equally worthy of note. But of all his endeavors, his duty as head of the high school was always closest to his heart. Putting tremendous energy into his work, he had the satisfaction of seeing the school modernized under his guidance and its curriculum improved until it attained its present high position in provincial education.
