

Harrison Gets Decision As Walls Spilled Twice

TORONTO (CP)—Earl Walls, Canada's leading contender for a shot at Rocky Marciano's world heavyweight title, has had his dreams all but shattered.

Moore Favored To Keep Title Against Maxim

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—A moody, tight-lipped Archie Moore, although heavily beset by marital troubles, is a 2-to-1 favorite to defend his light heavyweight boxing championship successfully against jabbing Joey Maxim in their 15-round outdoor fight in Miami Stadium tonight.

Archie's wife, Alice, dealt the champ a legal blow that hurt him worse than anything the light-punching Maxim can throw when she filed a separate-maintenance suit Tuesday that tied up his purse and will keep Archie in Florida until a settlement is reached.

The action was particularly painful to the 37-year-old Archie because tonight promises to be the richest of his 17-year career.

If predictions of a \$100,000 gate hold up, Moore's share will be in the neighborhood of \$52,000. He is to receive 40 per cent and Maxim 20 per cent of the net pot, which will be sweetened by \$50,000 in television and radio receipts.

Moore had been quiet and edgy even before his wife brought the legal action, possibly because of difficulty in making the 175-pound weight limit.

Archie, oldest of today's champions, had no weight trouble before. He scaled 172½ pounds when he lifted the title from Maxim in St. Louis, Dec. 17, 1952, and 173½ when he defended it against Maxim in their return match in Ogden, Utah, last June 24.

Tonight's fight will be broadcast and telecast nationally by CBS starting at 10 p.m. EST.

The 25-year-old holder of the Canadian heavyweight crown suffered his first defeat since 1951 Tuesday night when he lost an unanimous 10-round decision to eighth-ranking Tommy Harrison of Los Angeles. It was a bruising, belting fight, close all the way, that kept a record indoor crowd here of 14,737 on its feet most of the route.

"He beat me," said a slightly dejected Walls after the fight that drew a record gate of \$45,261 at Maple Leaf Gardens. Walls twice got up off the floor after nine counts to battle the lighter Harrison to the final bell.

Harrison came out unmarked. Walls suffered a cut around his left eye, two cuts on the bridge of his nose and mouse under his right eye.

STARTED FAST
Walls appeared set to end it early. He swarmed all over Harrison in the first two rounds and stunned him with hard lefts to the face and body.

But Harrison, who weighed 183 pounds against Walls' 190½, fought back to take the next two rounds and go ahead when he dumped Walls to the canvas for the nine count in the fourth with a hard right uppercut to the chin.

The fifth round was even and Harrison, fighting mainly from close in, again caught Walls with a right flush on the chin to spill him for a second nine count in the sixth.

WALLS HOLDING ON
They battled toe to toe the rest of the distance and Harrison finished off with a 10-round flurry of lefts that had Walls holding on at the end.

Walls said he would like to get another shot at the Los Angeles Negro and Harrison said he would oblige but first he has some business in New York—challenging world champion Rocky Marciano.

That challenge, he said, would be made Friday.

G & A Down Millers 58-49; Fraser and Payne Edge Stars

A persistent Gordon and Anderson squad took over undisputed possession of second place in the Senior B basketball league when they downed a pilotless Columbia Cellulose team 58-49 at the Civic Centre last night.

In the Inter A league Fraser and Payne maintained a steady lead to cut down the gap between them and league leading North Star Bottlers when they downed Jack Evans' squad 37-32.

Nelson Brothers dropped a heartbreaker to Inter B loop leaders Manson's by one point in the opening game by a 26-25 score. The loss pushed the Port Edward crew back into the cellar.

Rupe Holkestad paced the G & A pointgetters with Joe Davis showing improved form and netting 11 points, 8 of them from field goals. The game, played in a chilly atmosphere, saw the hardwaremen set up a 6-4 lead in the first quarter and increase it to 23-17 at the half.

CCC, minus the services of coach Pop Pay, took the third quarter 16-11 but faded in the final frame as Holkestad poured in 10 points. G & A took the quarter 24-16. Sid Scherk with 19 points paced the pulp millers with a 12-point assist from brother Don and 10 points from Bill Sunberg.

The senior game was delayed nearly half an hour due to a lack of referees. Bill Morrison had been injured in the Inter A game and Doug Sankey had already refereed the Inter B encounter.

However, Manson's Don Hartwig and Ray Spring came through handsomely and kept the game well in hand. The calls were close and a cleaner, faster game resulted.

Morrison's injury (a sprained ankle) at the 3.52 mark of the

last quarter made little difference to final outcome of the Inter A game. Fraser & Payne had served notice early that they were going to take the game and were never headed. Quarter scores were 7-5, 19-18, 26-22 and 37-32.

Freddy Kristmanson's hook shot netted F & P 15 points and Red Tait with 9 and Rey McKay with 11 sparked for the Bottlers. They both pulled off superb shots and passes.

Two missed free shots lost the game for Nelson Brothers as they had two chances at the 10-second mark of the last quarter and muffed them with the score 26-25 against them.
