Big Sales May Bring More Kitimat Work

OTTAWA (CP)—The Kitimat Aluminum project came in for mention today during the Right Honourable C. D. Howe's annual comment on the state of Canadian economy. Speaking of Kitimat, in his address as minister of trade and commerce, he said, "Assuming reasonable free access to the United States market, Canadian sales of aluminum are likely to be such as to necessitate completion of further stages of the Kitimat project. Mr. Howe, speaking of conditions generally, said his steady confidence has usually been in marked contrast with the gloomy predictions of some opposition speakers who have been quite sure that under the present government the country was going to the dogs. Mr. Howe offered two predictions: a tougher job of selling goods abroad next year, but a generally prosperous year at home. In his economic review, Mr. Howe said: 1. Overseas trade volume appears to be "firmly based" after some adjustment this year. Increased world wheat supplies likely will bring a reduction from the record export levels of the last two years. 2. "Sales prospects are probably firmer at home than in export markets." 3. There is every reason to look forward to a continued high capital spending. 4. A prospective shift in investment towards housing, commercial and institutional building will mean increased employment. 5. Government spending for defence and other purposes will continue to stabilize the economy. 6. Personal spending and income should remain near 1953 levels. Referring to 1953, Mr. Howe forecast increases would be evident in production, the physical volume of consumer purchases and a record increase in spending to increase productive facilities. These capital outlays, he said, may reach \$8,500,000,000, nine per cent higher than the record in 1952.
