OTTAWA (CP)—W. L. Journeaux, independent candidate in Bonaventure in the federal election, has withdrawn from the contest. Nelson Castonguay, chief electoral officer, was advised early this morning by the Bonaventure returning officer of the withdrawal, the fourth since nominations July 27, all in Quebec. Mr. Journeaux's withdrawal leaves a straight party fight in that riding for the elections Aug. 10, between Bona Arsenaault, Lib-

**Young German Sentenced
To Die For Fighting Reds**

BERLIN (AP)—A Russian-zone Communist court has sentenced a young German to death because he fought against the Reds in Indo-China as a member of the French Foreign Legion, West Berlin's anti-Communist League of Free Jurists reported today. This organization, which has good underground connections in the Russian zone, said Hans Hastreiter, 25, was condemned "for espionage and using weapons against a peace-loving people." Sentence was passed by a woman judge after a secret trial in the district court at Cottbus. Hastreiter is a West German who joined the Foreign Legion in 1946 and was captured in 1949. He was sent back to Soviet East Berlin and there released in 1951. But when he returned to the Russian zone to visit his wife he was seized by the secret police on charges of spying. His espionage, the Free Jurists said, is supposed to have consisted of telling people about his experiences in Indo-China.
