WAR CLAIMS COMMISSION
NOTICE

To ex-prisoners of war in Europe
(including merchant navy per-
sonnel), and to surviving de-
pendents of deceased prisoners
of war:

NOTICE is hereby given that the
War Claims Commission, with the
approval of the Government of Can-
ada, has today adopted an amended
interpretation of the War Claims
Rules applicable to claims for mal-
treatment of prisoners of war (in-
cluding merchant seamen) in Europe
during World War II.

Under the amended interpretation
there have been established three
presumptions of fact, applicable to
the majority of cases of this class:

- (1) (rebuttable) that some degree
of maltreatment was inflicted,
though sporadic and intermittent;
- (2) that some degree of incapacity
to work resulted;
- (3) that such incapacity subsisted
for some period or time after
liberation.

On the basis of these presump-
tions, it is anticipated that the very
great majority of claims of this class
on the strength of documentary evi-
dence provided by the claimants and
of corroboration secured by the Com-
mission, from official records, thus
relieving most individual claimants
from the burden and expense of at-
tending oral hearings.

It should be noted however, that
in order to avail themselves of the
amended interpretation of the Rules,
claimants who have not already given
notice of their intention to claim,
must forward such notice in writing
to the War Claims Commission, Ot-
tawa, Canada, on or before December
31, 1953.
