Marshall Meets Starr In Elks Challenge Card

Prince Rupert's Andy Marshall, B.C. Golden Gloves heavyweight champion for two years, has accepted the challenge of self-styled northern interior champion Freddy Starr, 185-pounder of Hazelton and Kispix.

The two will feature a five-round main event here June 29 on the Elks Club boxing card, it was announced today.

Starr, who was defeated by a Marshall TKO last year in Prince Rupert, wants to even the score with Elks Boxing Club's 175-pounder, then turn on Marshall's team mate Glen "Tiny" Carlson, 200-pounder, next month.

Arrangements of the fight card were announced by Al Manson and Sev Dominato, joint managers of Elks Boxing Club.

Supporting the main event of the card a week from Friday will be the semi-windy bout between Hazelton's Freddy Wale and Rupert's Chuck Place, fighting in the 140-pound division.

Third feature attraction is a bout in the same division between Billie Blackwater of Kispix and Elks' Chubby Stacey. Supporting these headliners will be five additional bouts, to be announced later.

Canada's An Olympic Flop Says Writer

"Canada's a wash-out where Olympics are concerned — and it's not the fault of the athletes. The fault lies with the Canadian Olympic Association, and with an apathetic public. It's high time we took the 'limp' out of the Olympics!"

That's the opinion of internationally-known sports coach Lloyd Percival, and in such outspoken words in the current June issue of New Liberty magazine, he denounces Canada's half-hearted participation in the Olympic contests.

"In 48 years of participation, Canada never has had a winning Olympic team, hasn't had a track-event winner since 1932. This year's games at Helsinki will cost Canadians \$145,000—a lot of money for failure when we could do better," says Percival.

Now busy prepping some of Canada's Olympic prospects, Percival outlines a plan of preparation and training which he believes would contribute greatly to the chances of a Canadian victory in the 1956 contests, and calls upon the public to take an interest in what's happening and to see that the job is done.

For after all, says Percival, there's little point in just sponsoring a boat-ride every Olympic year. It's high time Canadians got some return for their material contributions to the Canadian Olympic Association.

NEW YORK (CP)—Sam Mele equalled the record of modern major league runs batted in by driving in six runs, and Chicago White Sox almost wore out the base paths in a 12-run fourth inning last night as they swamped Philadelphia A's 15-4.

Mele, Hector Rodriguez and Al Zarilla clouted homers in the big frame.

Mele, equalling the record held by five others, belted a home run with two on and then cleared the sacks with a triple as 15 batters faced three Philadelphia hurlers during the White Sox's big splurge.

Yogi Berra clouted a pair of runs to lead the New York Yankees to 4-0 victory over Detroit Tigers. Soutapaw and Lopat blanked the Tigers, American League cellar dwellers, on four singles to square his record 3-4. The defeat was the first for the Tiger lefthander Ted Gray after five straight victories.

Brooklyn Dodgers retained a five-game lead in the National League as both Dodgers and second-place New York Giants lost.
