MP Urges Co-Operation With U.S.

LONDON (Reuters)—Mrs. Jean Mann, sharp-tongued Labor Member of Parliament, believes she has the secret for getting along with Americans, speak to them nicely.

"Every woman knows, when she goes out to get herself the most important thing in life, a man, that she does not arm herself with a bucketful of vinegar," said the 61-year-old grandmother who is one of 21 women in the House of Commons.

"More files get caught with a spoonful of honey. We have sent bucketfuls of vinegar to America when we should have close contact and co-operation."

Her latest idea for increasing British trade with the United States, and also easing the lot of housewives, is the production of run-proof nylons. They'd sell like hotcakes, she says.

This is just one of many ideas put forward by this active woman who is known as "the housewives' voice" by her supporters and "the woman who talks most through her hat" by her enemies.

She is a former member of the Glasgow city council, a magistrate, a housing expert (she once planned a model town for 30,000), an accountant, business woman, lecturer and happily-married mother of five children, three of them doctors.

In a legislative body not noted for its interest in women's affairs she has raised her determined Scots voice against slums, over-crowding, the cost of housing, poor clothing standards, badly planned kitchens in state subsidized houses, electric light bills, care of the aged, divorce, smutty jokes on the radio, discipline of teen-age daughters, juvenile delinquency and anti-Americanism in Britain.

Among other things, including run-proof nylons, she has fought for sales tax reductions, marriage guidance, sex instruction in schools, legal rights for the housewife and recreation for the young.

"The cure for juvenile delinquency is not bigger and better police forces and jails but bigger and better homes and recreation centres," she says.

Although she is a Socialist she quarrels with her own party as often as she tilts with the Tories.

Prison Quiet As Rioters Back to Cells

SALEM, Ore. (AP)—The Oregon prison—torn four days by strike, riot and rebellion—was quiet today.

The last of the 1,000 rebelling convicts, cowed by discomfort, meagre food and little water, were returned to their cells tonight.

They were taken in groups of 20 from the prison recreation yard, where they have been held since Saturday, and locked up. Warden Clarence Gladden said they were docile and respectful.

Work was to begin soon to repair the \$100,000 damage wrought by Saturday's brief but intensive rioting.

Gladden said 21 ringleaders of the revolt, which started last Friday with a sitdown strike, now are in isolation cells.

The first flareup occurred Friday night when Gladden rejected convict demands saying that standards of food, clothing and medicine already were high.

Guards were withdrawn to prevent the taking of hostages and the convicts had the run of many of the prison buildings. Saturday morning prisoners tried to rush the penitentiary's main control room.
