Watch the Communist Moves

VITH hints of a Korean truce emanating from W Asia, the question of the moment is what is going on inside Russia and Red China?

The degree of uncertainty among close obserers may be judged from two such conflicting opinons as the following, both presumably based on the est available information:

"Afraid of internal stresses; possessing great striking power; tempted to use the Jews as an excuse; convinced that the West is weak and disunited-Russia may launch into an adventure of the most dangerous kind," speculates the highly reputed Intelligence Digest, published at New York. "The truth is that, although in many respects powerful, Russia faces the possibility of a complete crash. It is this very factor which increases the danger of

The Canadian Institute of International Affairs takes a different view." The idea expressed in some quarters that the new rulers might try to distract the populace from internal grievances by deliberately creating an external crisis has little to commend it. The overwhelming desire of the Soviet people for peace is clearly indicated by the stress laid on this theme in Soviet domestic propaganda.

"War would bring new miseries and would again lash the hope for an improvement in living condiions. It is by fulfilling these hopes that the new men would do most to consolidate their power.

Although Malenkov and Co. alone know what their intentions are, there are certain self-evident facts from which an outsider might draw a few sensible conclusions and, on the basis of these, the second line of reasoning sounds the more logical. As the Canadian body observes, the new leaders are faced with a need of strengthening their position. Until they have accomplished this, it is unreasonable to suppose they will start any dangerous "adventure" because war, more than anything else, would provide a crucial test of their authority-particularly as the army has been excluded from all top three policy-making positions.

In addition, there is no cause to believe that Russia's most powerful ally, Red China, has been so quickly and completely won over by the new regime that it will rush with a glad cry into whatever further battle Russia cares to dictate. Human nature being what it is, there is even a possibility that Mao and Malenkov have an acute personal distaste for each other in spite of their Communist bond. Certainly there is nothing in the lives of the Russian office strategist and the Chinese rebel which suggests common grounds for an abiding friendship.

Although Communists throughout the world will continue their rat-like invasion through the sewerpipes of civilization, we can hope that the masters at home will have the sense to see that any attempts to exploit this insidious destruction would be unwise.


