

Tito Worries

Soviet world shows signs of worry that Yugoslavia's Marshal Tito, with western approval, plans an attack this summer on Albania — the Kremlin's tiny, isolated satellite.

The Red press has voiced such fears during the last few days. The Reds' concern, of course, may mean something else-perhaps that the eight-rear-old regime of Albania's Premier Enver Health's allowing fast, and Mescow mans to blame its downfall-it it comes-on the Yngoslav president who broke with the Cominform.

Western sources report Albania - surrounded by Yugoslavia, Greece and the Adriatic and linked with the Cominform nations only by an occasional ship and a once-weekly airplane flight—is somerming with unrest unequalled elsewhere behind the Iron Curtain.



LONDON (AP)—Speculation has developed that Queen Mary left large fortunes to several lessaffluent members of the Royal Family, including Princess Margaret.

Other probable heirs would be the Queen's two surviving sons, the Dukes of Windsor and Gloucester: her daughter, the Princess Royal, and her daughterin-law, the Duchess of Kent.

The wills of royalty are never published, so the size of the Queen's estate and her distribution of it will never be publicly known.

Queen Mary, however, had long been reputed to be the wealthiest member of the Royal Family, and it was considered likely that she would provide for relatives without large personal fortunes.

Queen Elizabeth has an assured annual income from the state of £475,000. Some reports have estimated

the fortune of the Queen Grandmother at between £3,000,000 and £7,000,000. ANNUAL GRANT

Since her husband, King George V. died 17 years ago, she received an annual grant of £70,000 and is believed to have inherited the bulk of the large fortune left by her husband, who received it from his father Edward VII, and his grandmother, Queen Victoria.
