Belgian Navy Making Strides

BRUSSELS (Reuters) - Belgium is making strides toward having a standing navy for the first time in her history.

For more than a century, Parliament and public opinion have boycotted every effort to provide the country with an efficient naval force, for which two world wars have at last proved the necessity.

The Belgian Navy has just celebrated its eighth anniversary. It is still a small force, for so far only about one-third of the program has been com-

At the end of last year, the navy comprised six ocean-going minesweepers, 10 coastal minesweepers. a 4,500-ton troop transport, a convoy escort frigate and a squadron of motor patrol boats on the Rhine.

In all, about 60 vessels, mainly minesweepers, are envisaged. Eight coastal and 18 river minesweepers are to be built in Belgium this year, while nearly 30 more ships of the same type will be constructed by the end of

The United States is helping to build up the new navy by providing 28 coastal minesweepers of which several have already






