

## Drew Promises Better Deal for Civil Service

OTTAWA.—Hon. George Drew took the platform in Canada's capital Wednesday night to promise better treatment of the civil service if a Progressive Conservative government is voted to power Aug. 10.

He outlined the civil service plank in his party's election platform and said his treatment of Ontario's civil service while premier of that province after 1943 shows the promise will be carried out.

Mr. Drew also said the Progressive Conservatives are the only party that can form a government that will reduce taxes and "open the books on the waste and staggering inefficiency of this government."

The speech was made before 1,000 persons in Ottawa's Lansdowne Park—part of his own constituency of Carleton which includes both urban and rural areas. Later he attended a church social at South March 10 miles west of Ottawa.

The Progressive Conservative leader speaks today at Pembroke and Renfrew, Ont. On part of his planned itinerary—

a visit to Petawawa camp—has been cancelled. Service and election regulations ban campaigning in armed services camps.

The party platform pledged permanent classification to "many thousands" of civil servants—all but casual employees—now classified as temporary. It would encourage promotion within the civil service "to the highest ranks" and provide pay and working conditions comparable "in every way" to industry and commerce throughout Canada.

Mr. Drew said that 10 years ago, campaigning as his party's Ontario leader against a Liberal government, he had promised to end "political hiring and firing" in the Ontario civil service. He was prepared to stand on his record of dealings with the civil service as premier of Ontario.

Turning to his party's promise of a \$500,000,000 annual cut in federal taxes, he said the Liberal government can not pretend it has demonstrated any concern for the little taxpayer.

The proposed tax cuts would give the most benefit to pensioners and others with incomes too small to pay income taxes by meeting the problem of sales and excise taxes on necessities.

## Drew's Tax Proposals 'Disaster'

WINNIPEG.—Prime Minister St. Laurent says re-allocation of tax fields proposed by George Drew, Progressive Conservative leader, would mean "disaster" for most provinces.

What Mr. Drew does not seem to be able to understand, said Mr. St. Laurent, is that the federal-provincial tax agreements which he criticizes and wants to change strengthen the finances of the provinces.

For example, Manitoba this year would receive \$24,300,000 from the federal treasury as a payment in return for giving up certain tax fields. If the province had levied the taxes in the fields it vacated, they would have yielded only \$17,000,000.

In other words, in the present year, the best estimate of the advantage to the people of this province is over \$7,300,000 a year, over and above the tremendous advantage of having much lower provincial tax rates," said Mr. St. Laurent, speaking at a rally Wednesday night on behalf of Manitoba's 14 Liberal candidates in the Aug. 10 vote.

In an earlier speech he described communism as a "godless, reactionary and destructive doctrine" which had to be "watched and countered" in Canada.

Speaking before the fourth all-Canada Ukrainian - Canadian committee, Mr. St. Laurent advocated for Canada no outright ban of Communist activity as proposed by Mr. Drew, but rather a policy of vigilance bolstered with a strong economy to prevent misery and other breeding grounds for communism.

As for those who seek to throw off their chains behind the iron curtain in East Europe, Mr. St. Laurent said Canada is in sympathy with the uprisers, but cautioned against raising any false hope of armed support for them.

"It would be cruelly misleading," he said, "if we were to give them the impression in our propaganda or our policies that we now were in a position to give them armed assistance."

Mr. St. Laurent flies to Vancouver today for another political address and a national radio broadcast outlining the Liberal party's platform.

## CCF Leader Says Liberals To Lose Seats

HARRIS, Sask.—CCF leader M. J. Coldwell went to a country picnic Wednesday and predicted the Liberal party will lose seats and the Progressive Conservatives may win some in the Aug. 10 federal election.

The women of this Saskatchewan farming community 40 miles southwest of Saskatoon fed the CCF leader potato salad and a wedge of two-inch thick lemon pie after Mr. Coldwell watched part of a baseball game and talked to district farmers and their wives.

He touched on a subject close to the hearts of his listeners, saying a CCF government would establish a national livestock board and "consider nationalizing the packing house industry."

He said the livestock board would be set up at once.

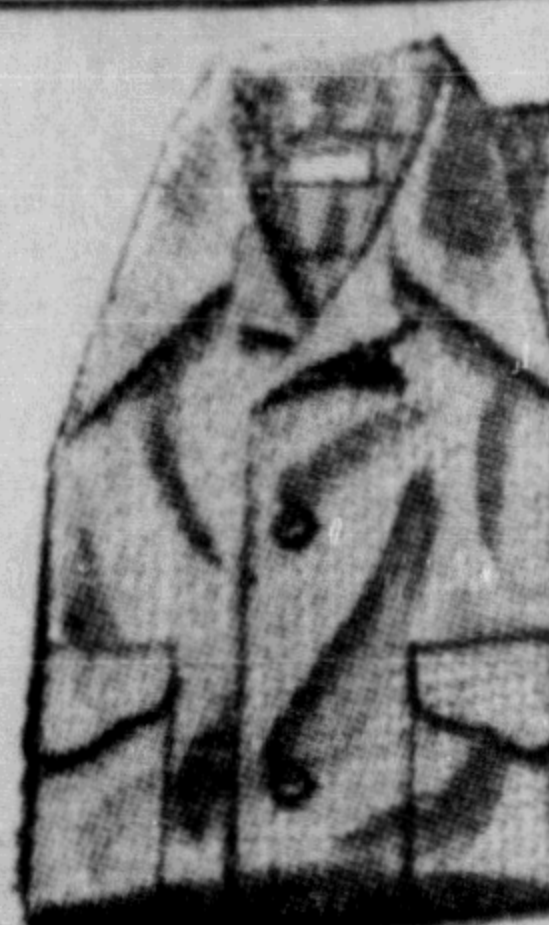
