

Unofficial Report in London Paper Says Alexander Threatening to Quit

LONDON (CP)—Prime Minister Churchill called an emergency meeting to consider revolts threatening within the ranks of his Conservative party. Ministers hurried to 10 Downing Street amid reports that Field Marshal Earl Alexander might resign as defence minister in the row over retirement pensions for First World War officers.

The Liberal News Chronicle said Wednesday in a front-page story that "unofficial" reports are circulating that the former governor-general of Canada is threatening to resign "after a row in the cabinet."

Press speculation was based at least in part on the choice of the Marquess of Salisbury to make known the government's decision on retirement pensions in the House of Lords. Until Tuesday night, Lord Alexander had answered questions on the subject in the Lords, and had promised a statement this week.

Lord Alexander's absence from the upper house was commented on by several newspapers. The independent Times said the decision on pensions was no doubt "unpalatable" to the defence minister.

The storm over pensions broke with the announcement, by Lord Salisbury in the Lords and by Prime Minister Churchill in the Commons, that the government had decided not to give special treatment to some 330 retired service officers whose pensions were stabilized in 1935 at 9 1/2 per cent below the 1919 level.

Three Big Drug Rings Operate in Vancouver

VANCOUVER (CP)—Three major drug rings are operating in Vancouver doing business estimated at millions of dollars a year, two city police detectives said Monday night.

Detectives Rex Gray and Clifford Mead of the police narcotics squad told a Public Affairs Institute meeting that the only way to combat spreading drug addiction is to "quarantine all known addicts for the rest of their lives."

More Than 56,000 Treated For Cancer During Year

VANCOUVER—More than 56,000 treatments and examinations for cancer were given between April, 1952, and March, 1953, at the British Columbia Cancer Institute, Vancouver, Dr. A. M. Evans, director of the institute, reported at the annual meeting of the B.C. Cancer Foundation here Wednesday.

This represents a 21.5 per cent increase over the previous year, when approximately 46,000 examinations and treatments were given.

Dr. Evans pointed out that the increase in facilities at the institute, rather than a rise in the incidence of cancer in B.C., was largely responsible for the noticeable increase in examinations and treatments.

He said the number of new patients admitted this fiscal year to the Institute, 1,447 compared to 1,312 in the previous fiscal year, showed an increase of 10 per cent. X-ray and cobalt treatments increased 14.7 per cent.

Of the 1,447 new patients admitted, 963 had cancer, 463 did not have cancer. Nearly 700 of those patients were from outside Vancouver.

Speaking of the ten consultative cancer clinics in B.C. operated by B.C. Cancer Foundation, Dr. Evans said the Institute staff had made a total of 60 visits to these clinics this year, including two to Prince Rupert.

DOGS, CATS OUTNUMBER UNITED STATES CHILDREN

NEW YORK (AP)—Families in the United States have about as many cats and dogs as they do children, says National Family Opinion, Inc., a research organization. There are more dogs and cats—49,300,000 of them than there are American households—41,000,000. This means that there are 1.2 dogs and cats in the average home.

Cats outnumber dogs by 26,700,000 to 22,600,000. But it's just that more people have fewer dogs, while less people have more cats.
