Trafton Not Tipping Hand On Any of 105 Grid Plays

AURORA, Ont. (CP)—George (Thunder) Trafton has 105 football plays. He won't talk about any of them.

The 56-year-old coach of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers clams up at mention of defensive or offensive strategy for the Grey Cup final against Hamilton Tiger-Cats in Toronto Saturday.

"What do you think I am?" Trafton roared a few minutes before the Blue Bombers' light drill Wednesday. "I'm not running every two-bit football team in the country. I'm supposed to be calling the shots for Winnipeg."

That's why, the voluble Trafton added, the Blue Bombers are holding practice sessions in secrecy.

"This is the big time," he said. "I'm running a big-time football club and every Tom, Dick and Harry isn't going to sneak around us."

Trafton made his comments while fingering a couple of little black books with his plays just before the Bombers headed for practice at nearby St. Andrew's College, about 30 miles north of Toronto.

Rangers Reverse Tactics, Rally to Trim Bruins

Somebody must have told New York Rangers the fable about the hare and the tortoise.

Frank Boucher's fifth-placers have broken the hearts of the New York faithful time and

again this season by scooting into an early lead in their National Hockey League games, only to run out of gas in the last period and yield victory to their opponents.

Last night they reversed the procedure. Boston Bruins scored the first goal, led 3-2 at the end of two periods and finished on the short end of a 5-3 count at the final bell.

It was an important victory for the New Yorkers. The fourth-place Bruins still lead them by five points but the two clubs play again at Boston tonight and another Ranger win could put them well within striking distance of the last play-off spot.

Joe Klukay finally gave Boston the lead shortly after the half-way mark of the opening period, only to have Eddie Kullenman tie the score four minutes later.

Ike Hildebrand, the reformed New Westminster lacrosse player, gave the Rangers a brief edge 46 seconds after the second frame opened, but within five minutes Boston bounced back with tallies by Milt Schmidt and Leo Labine.

Hildebrand's second goal squared matters at 3:39 of the third period. Barely a minute later, Wally Hergesheimer put New York in front for keeps.

The last Ranger goal was a gift. With Boston goalie Jim Henry out of the nets in favor of an extra forward, defenceman Harry Howell cleared from behind the New York net. The puck caromed off the side boards and drifted lazily into the empty Bruin cage.

In their current swing through the Prairie section of the Western Hockey league, New Westminster Royals are finding the competition a bit too tough to handle.

The revamped Edmonton Eskimos, mired deep in the league cellar, flashed some of their championship brilliance of last season as they handed the third-place Royals a humiliating 7-2 shellacking in Wednesday night's only scheduled fixture.

The loss came on top of a 4-2 defeat at the hands of Saskatoon Quakers Tuesday night. Royals close out their road trip tonight against second-place Calgary Stampede.

Record Gate Seen For Grey Cup

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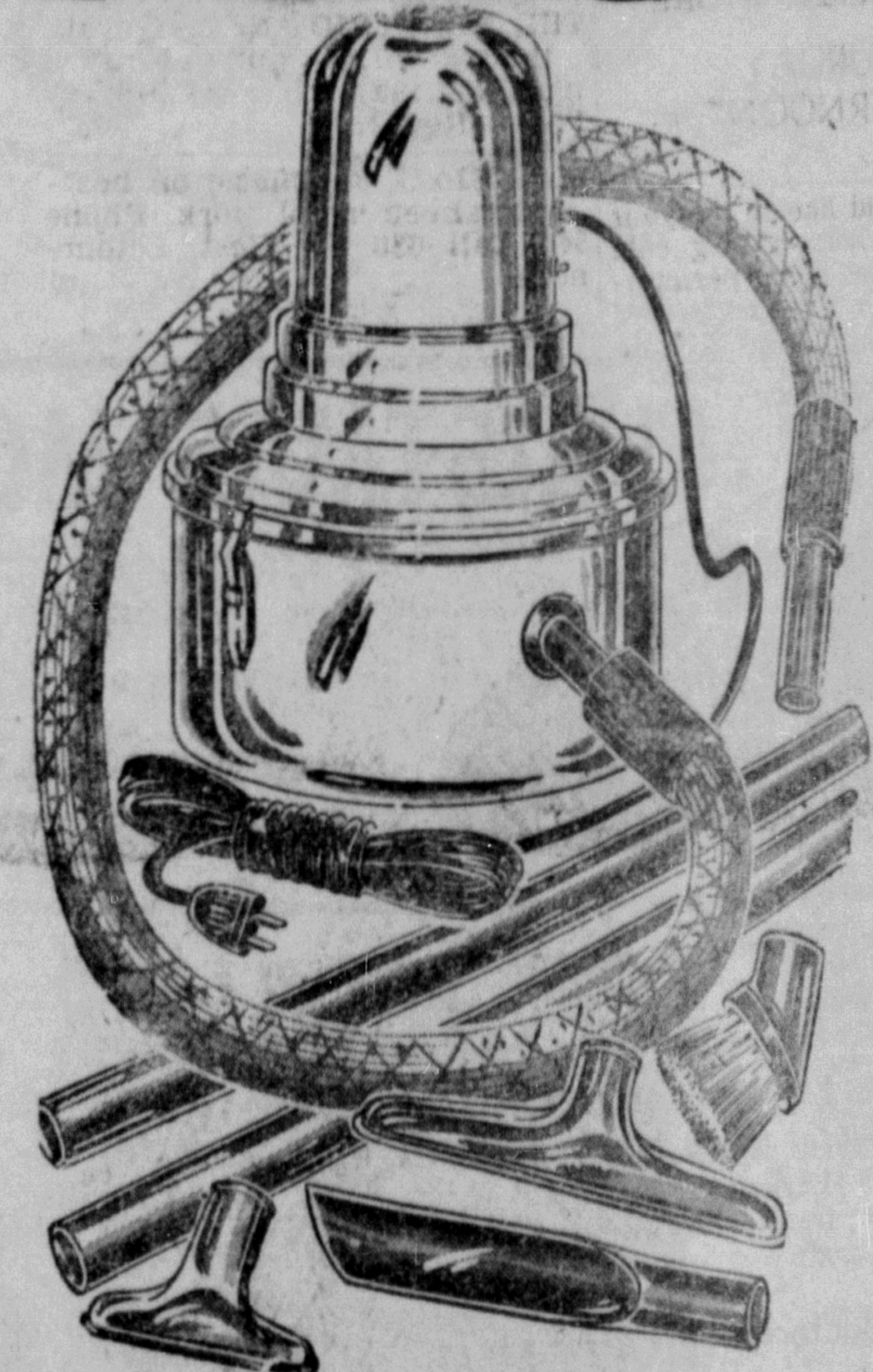
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
