Police Chief, Two Henchmen Arrested for Violating Law

MOSCOW (Reuters)—The security police chief in the Soviet state of Georgia, where Stalin was born, has been arrested along with two henchmen for framing charges against three other party men.

Veteran M. Bakridze, Georgia's newly-elected premier, said the arrested men face "stern punishment." The victims of the "frame-up" have all been taken into the state cabinet, one filling the security post, the premier added.

He named those arrested by surnames only, State Security Minister Rukhadze and party secretaries Charkmiani and Mgeladze. Avksentii N. Rapava had been given Rukhadze's ministry in the new Georgian government.

The two other victims, Mikhail I. Baramiya and Zodelava, have been made agriculture minister and vice-premier respectively.

Bakridze declared in a recent

speech to the Georgian Supreme Soviet: "By gross violation of Soviet Socialist laws, by trampling underfoot the rights of Soviet citizens and all kinds of machinations, Rukhadze and his myrmidons attempted to arouse discontent in Soviet people and tried to inflame feelings of national hostility."

He said Rukhadze and his conspirators had the innocent men seized by the police on false evidence in an attempt to "do harm to the Communist party and Soviet power."

The Supreme Soviet confirmed the appointments of two vice-premiers and 16 ministers of the new Georgian government, which now is composed on the same lines as the Malenkov central government in Moscow.

Among the most noteworthy appointments is that of the well-known Georgian motion picture director, Vladimir E. Chikareli, who made "Road to Berlin," as minister of culture.

A check today showed the U.S. government is confiscating automobiles at around one a day.

When a particularly classy automobile comes along, it is turned over to a department head who has been asking for another car.

The atomic energy commission last week was given a powder blue Cadillac taken from a Honolulu narcotics runner. It will be re-painted black.

Narcotics, with the exception of heroin, are kept by the government. It is stockpiling narcotics, just as it is stockpiling other important materials for a national emergency. Heroin is destroyed, and for a good reason: It has no medical value.

The government also has picked up diamonds from smugglers. These are held until they can be swapped for industrial diamonds. Then these, too, will go into the stockpile.

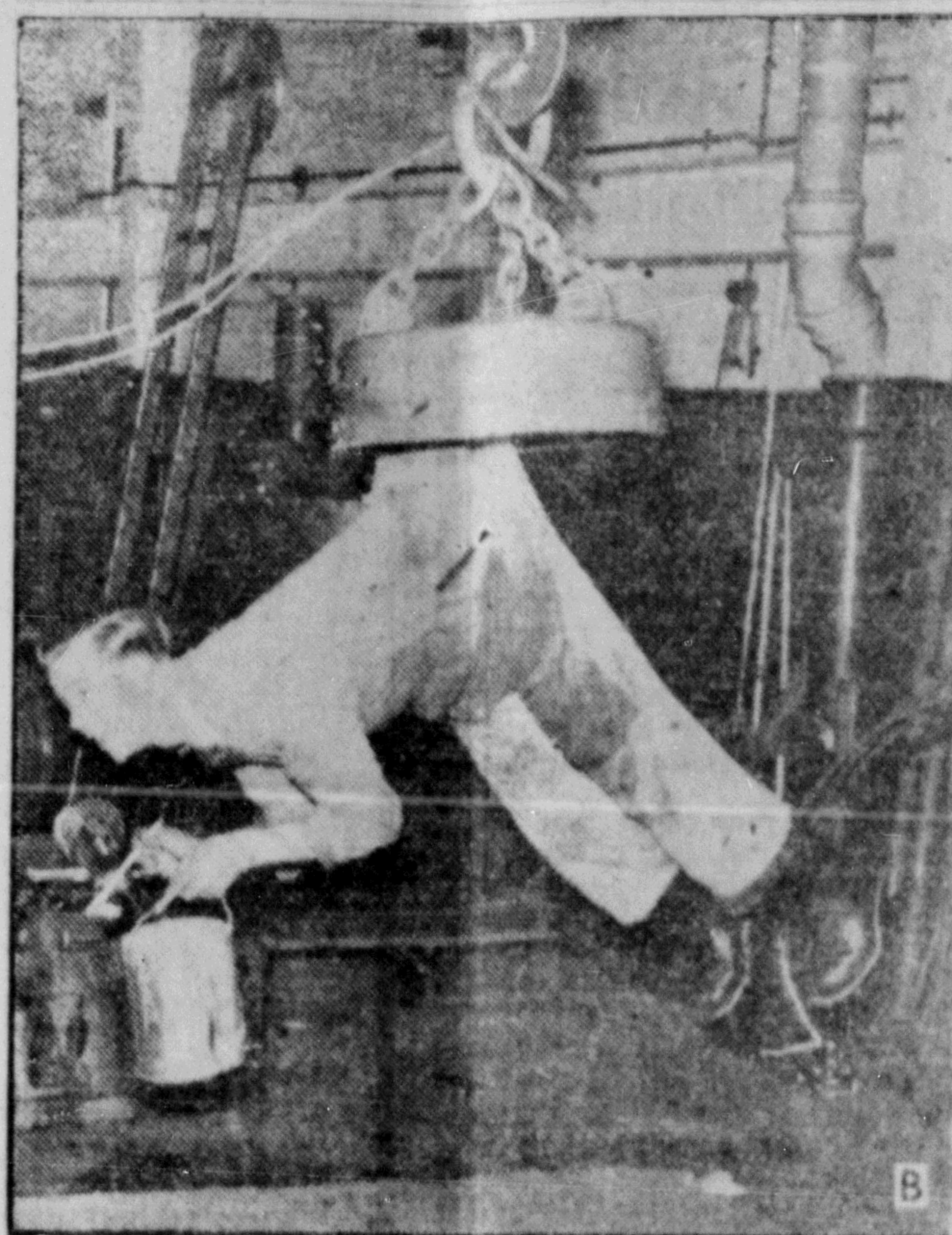
The seizure business is booming, from \$1,100,000 three years ago to \$2,500,000 last year.

Funeral Service Planned Once For Wounded Soldier

QUEBEC — Mrs. Yvonne Dugal once planned to have a funeral service for her son, Paul, missing in action in Korea and presumed dead. She did not go through with the plans because she was convinced her son still lived.

A telephone call from Korea Sunday night informed her that her 20-year-old son was among the prisoners exchanged at Freedom Village.

"I never despaired of seeing him again," said Mrs. Dugal in an interview. "I took steps some time ago to have a funeral service for him. At the last minute, I decided to wait, convinced that he was still alive."

"I never despaired of seeing my Paulo, even if I did cash

his insurance policies some time ago."

Paul, a member of the Royal 22nd Regiment, was reported missing and presumed dead June 23, 1952. Mrs. Dugal heard no more until Sunday night. She was summoned to a neighbor's house to take a call from Korea.

Overcome with emotion, she fainted when the call was completed. She was told that Paul would leave hospital in three or four weeks.

The 51-year-old mother attributed her son's release to her many prayers.

Irish Immigrant Got \$16 For Working 70-Hour Week

HALIFAX — A group of 350 Irish immigrants arrived here aboard the liner Georgic with money and jobs on their minds.

David Corbett, a 35-year-old Belfast, wanted to know if Canadians are a "saving" people. "I mean, do they make enough money to put some in the bank?" "Most of us made enough to live but we couldn't save anything, not a quid," said Corbett, who earned about £7 (\$19.90) weekly as a furniture store salesman and paid £5 for lodging and food.

Majority of the immigrants, largest single group to leave the country in 25 years, are farmers coming under an assistance scheme whereby the Canadian government loans them \$196 each and finds them a job. Most are bound for Alberta. Joe Joseph

Lavery, 21, of County Armagh, who often worked a 70-hour week for \$16.

"It wasn't enough for the work," said Joe, who will be placed on a farm when he reaches Calgary.

Many of the farmers were encouraged to come to Canada by advertisements and films shown by touring members of the Canadian office in Belfast.

A large proportion of skilled and semi-skilled workers of all kinds were among the group, whose average age was about 30. Unlike the farmers and domestics, they have no assurance of jobs but are hopeful of finding them.

Record Tourist Season Forecast for Canada

Holiday memo for Americans: If you can't get to Britain for the Coronation, come to Canada, where Elizabeth II is also Queen. This is one of the lures being held out to United States tourists by travel bureaux across the country as Canada prepares for probably its biggest tourist season in history.

Other factors which should boost the industry: Canada's industrial development has become front-page news in the U.S.; there won't be an American presidential campaign this year; the foot-and-mouth disease has run its course, enabling American hunters to take home their kills.

D. Leo Dolan, Canadian government travel chief, says his department has received its biggest number of inquiries in history—122,000 between January 1 and March 21, a 54 per cent increase over 1952.

All indications point to the biggest travel year we've ever had," Mr. Dolan says. The industry was worth \$276,000,000

last year, six per cent more than in 1951.

British Columbia last year took in \$63,000,000, expects \$70,000,000 this year. It looks for 1,600,000 visitors, about 900,000 of them from the U.S.

The largest proportion—34 per cent—like to go fishing. Television spot announcements are being used on seven stations in Pacific coast states to attract visitors.
