Mine Founder Leaves Money For New Church
WINDSOR, N.S. (CP)—Edmund Horne, the Nova Scotia prospector who discovered the great Noranda base metals mine after nearly half a century of lonely toil, left an estate valued at \$950,000 when he died March 15, aged 88.
His will, probated here, bequeathed \$26,500 to various orphanages and charitable institutions and \$50,000 for construction of a church at Enfield, N.S., where he was born.

Bridge

Correct Bidding Principles
Win Against Best Defence

The magic figures 65, 75, 85 and 90 are particularly helpful to the player whose partner has opened the bidding. With 65 per cent of the high cards, a partnership should be in game at no trump or a major; 75 per cent will usually make game in a minor; 85 per cent, a small slam, and over 90 per cent, a grand slam.

An opening bid of one in a suit promises a minimum of one-third of the high cards.

If you, the opener's partner, hold less than one honor trick, you pass. With a little more, but less than one-fourth of the high cards, you plan to bid just once unless subsequently forced by partner.

With an average hand (one ace, one king, one queen and one jack, or the equivalent) you plan to make two bids. An example would be where you respond in a suit of your own on the first round and, if partner makes a minimum rebid in his suit, give him a single raise.

When partner opens the bidding and you hold one-third of the high cards, you can immediately decide to reach game at no trump or a major suit. In other words you are assured that the partnership holds about 65 per cent of the top strength. Of course, you may stop short of game when the hand is an obvious misfit.

In today's deal, Mrs. Keen held enough for just one bid. With four cards in her partner's bid suit, she correctly decided to make the most descriptive bid available, a raise to two hearts. That was all Mr. Champion wanted to know and he promptly contracted for game. Miss Brash cashed the ace of clubs and shifted to the four of diamonds. Mr. Dale won with the ace of diamonds and returned the queen of clubs. It was covered with the king and Miss Brash ruffed. She led the trey of spades.

At this point it appears that Mr. Champion has no way to get rid of his remaining club loser. Yet he made his contract against the best possible defence. Check your play with Mr. Champion's which will be shown in tomorrow's column.

British Team Starts Climb Up Everest
KATMANDU, Nepal (AP)—The 13-man British Mount Everest expedition, led by 42-year-old Colonel John Hunt, has started its march into the Khumbu glaciers on the first stage of the ascent.

The party marched through heavy rain for two days before the weather improved and gave them a clear view of Everest, a report said. This is regarded as a sign of good weather to come.

During a three-week stay at Thyangbuchi the climbers staged "experimental" ascents of two 20,000-foot peaks. Last year an unsuccessful Swiss Everest expedition established its first advance camp 17,225 feet up the glaciers.

Scientists Find Salmon Nearly Human
SEATTLE (AP)—A trio of Washington scientists have discovered that salmon are almost human—when they get sick.

Prof. E. J. Ordal of the University of Washington and Brian J. Eap and C. H. Ellis of the Department of Fisheries were studying kidney disease in young salmon when they found the fish also were subject to tuberculosis.

The department has published a 72-page paper on the results of the study, the first basic publication on kidney disease in salmon.
