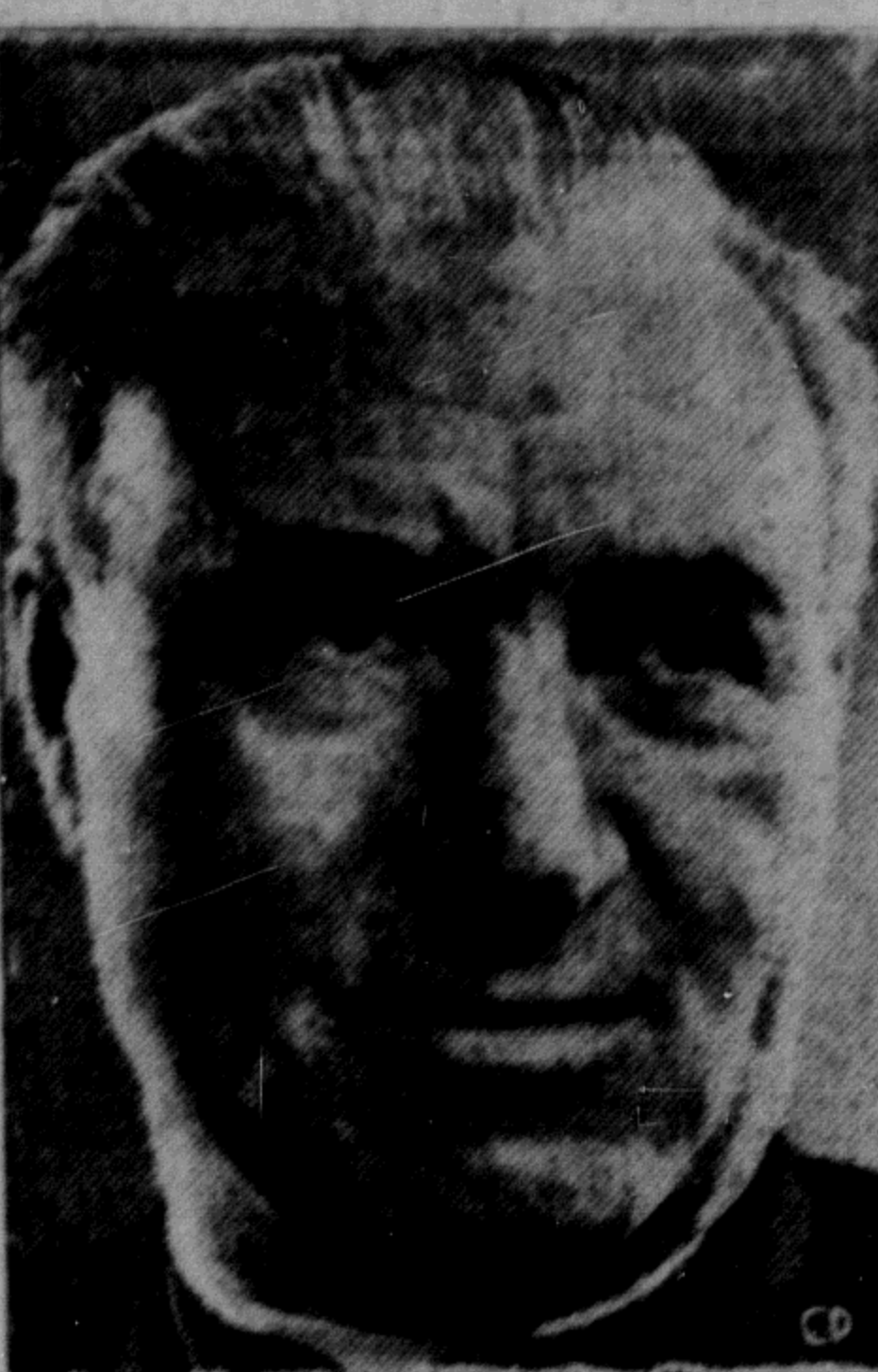

BLACKWOOD on Bridge

There Are Several Ways Of Evaluating Your Hand

There is a certain inherent logic of cards which is more important than any bidding "system." In spite of the fact that bidding methods have become pretty well standardized in the last few years, there are still a number of different ways of evaluating a hand.

However, it is a fact that whether you count honor tricks or use some point-count method, you end up at the same spot on the great majority of hands.

Some of the methods referred to are rather intricate and detailed. For those looking for simplification, you will do all right if you remember four magic figures. These are 65, 75, 85 and 90.

Sixty-five per cent of the high cards in the partnership will furnish a reasonable play for game at no-trump or in a major suit.

Seventy-five per cent will give you a fair play for game in a minor suit.

Eighty-five per cent puts you in the small slam zone. With over 90 per cent you will have an odds-on chance for a grand slam.

These figures hold when your side has no particular distributional advantages. With distributional assets in the form of long, solid suits, singletons, voids, exceptionally well-fitting partnership hands, etc., you need a little less in high cards.

Apply your favorite method of valuation to the North-South cards in today's hand. Mrs. Keen and Mr. Masters have about 65 per cent of the high cards. Failing to find a good enough fit in a suit, they properly reached game at no-trump.

his last spade which Mr. Masters won with the king. The ace of diamonds was cashed and Mr. Meek's play of the queen was noted.
