1500 Firms Join Payroll System

VICTORIA (CP) — A total of 1,500 firms have joined the B.C. Hospital Insurance payroll deduction system of premium payment.

Health Minister Eric Martin said this represents 35,000 new registrations and about 100,000 persons.

There now is a total of 5,200 firms on the payroll deduction plan. This means a total of about 230,000 British Columbians are covered under the payroll deduction plan instead of direct payment.

Muzzy Almost Drives Heinsite To Quit Game

Mr. Heinsite was about ready to quit the game after this hand. He made a truly great defensive play which, in all justice deserved a better fate.

But Mr. Muzzy made his contract anyway. It wasn't so much that Mr. Heinsite's fine play was nullified but the manner in which it was done that irritated him.

Mr. Abel's opening lead was the king of diamonds. Dummy ducked and Mr. Heinsite went into a huddle. A mental review of the bidding and a look at his own hand, the dummy and the opening lead convinced him that Mr. Abel couldn't possibly have an entry in clubs or spades.

In other words, Mr. Muzzy had to have the ace of spades and the king-queen of clubs for his opening bid.

The only possible chance for Mr. Abel to get in to run his diamonds lay in the heart suit. If he held the queen of hearts there would be no problem. But if he held something like three to the 10, it was necessary for Mr. Heinsite to get his ace and king out of the way at once.

Accordingly he dropped the king of hearts at trick one. Mr. Abel followed with the queen of diamonds, dummy's ace won and Mr. Heinsite bravely discarded the ace of hearts.

Mr. Muzzy now saw nine tricks. If the spade finesse worked. He cashed three clubs and Mr. Abel discarded a diamond on the third round of the suit. He laid down the ace of

CCL Urges Employment Program

OTTAWA (CP)—The Canadian Congress of Labor told the government today there are "disquieting features" in Canada's economy and called for action to head off any recession.

The 375,000-member CCL, making its annual legislative submission to the cabinet, asked that the treasury lay out funds to boost employment.

"If bad spots and soft spots of employment are not to develop into something worse," it said, "the government will have to develop a comprehensive public assistance plan . . . and promote new industries in, or transfer workers from, depressed areas."

Another major recommendation of the congress was for what it called an "external affairs consultative committee" to act in an advisory capacity to the Canadian delegation at the United Nations.

Discussing the throne speech announcement of prospective mortgage money from the banks to finance housing, the CCL said: "The most urgent need is for subsidized public housing."

The government could do this, the CCL added, under the National Housing Act.
