Radio reports indicated that in south Alberta the tugs were towing barges laden with costly machinery and equipment being delivered from Vancouver to Kemano.



The barrel boat is equipped with two small hommocks, charcoal stove, batteries, lights, concentrated foods and a motorcycle. Mr. Charlton, who originally had the plan to cross the ocean to England in the strange craft, said the motorcycle was for touring the country. The barrel, six feet nine inches in diameter and 10 feet long, has a 700-pound keel and a 250 pound rudder and a stabilizing scoop at the stern. There is a 29-foot mast with three sails.

# 4000 New

Steady Flow of Immigrants Through Halifax This Week-End

HALIFAX - More than 4,000 new Canadians arrived at Halifax since Saturday. Canadian National Railways operated 13 Dumbarton 1, Dundee Unit- boat trains from dockside to Montreal, Toronto and Winnipes.

Starting off the steady flow of immigrants was the arrival of the Cunard liner Georgic with 1,463 passengers Saturday. The other transatlantic ships were the Ryndam with 318, Qrosc. Kulm with 851 and the Ascania with 577 Sunday, and the Vulcania with 753 and the Skaubryn with 1,155 today. The arrivals this week-end

brought the total number of inimigrants welcomed at Halifax during the month of March to 14,600, the largest number to arrive this year in any month and exceeding last year's record month. They are going to every section of Canada from the Atlantic provinces to the Pacific

To transport the heavy month's immigration traffic, the Canadian National will have operated 29 special trains from dockside as well as a number of extra cars on regular trains. During the month the company had to marshal 450 sleepers, colonist, dining and restaurant and bag-
