Rocky isn't exactly graceful, granted. He doesn't dance about on his toes and make picture moves. He's too busy and impatient to waste any time posing and posturing. But we insist he isn't awkward and will bet that Ezzard Charles would be the first to agree.

No man who can hit such a cagey and experienced dude as Charles the way Marciano did the other night can be awkward. Neither can he be clumsy to any marked degree. He might look so at times but the boxer who is so unfortunate as to be in the ring with him knows better in

#### ELUSIVE TARGET

Those who called Rocky awkward after his last fight pointed mainly to the many wild swings he missed after he got Charles Roy Helland, who pitched the in serious trouble in the sixth round and was trying desperately to score a knockout. What they overlooked was the fact that Ezzard, though badly hurt still had a clear head and knew how to make himself an elusive one hit and one walk, registering

Under the circumstances, we thought Rocky was rather restrained, if anything. He did not go windmilling in and let Charles tie him up. He stalked Ez. carefully and threw his looping right only as he appeared to have a clear target. That more of them did not land solidly on Ez's jaw and perhaps end the fight right there was more testimonial to the challenger's great defensive skill than proof of the champion's awkwardness.
