Toronto Area Topic of Novel By Newsman

A district of Toronto which has gradually lost its individuality and merged with surrounding areas is immortalized in "Cabbagetown Store" (Ryerson), in which J. V. McAree recalls his boyhood home.

Mr. McAree, columnist with the Globe and Mail. remembers an earlier and more peaceful Cabbagetown than is portrayed in Hugh Garner's recent novel ay that name,

In the period covered by Mr Garner, the east-central district had become a tough, urban sium area. Mr. McAree's recollections date from a time not far removed from the days when residents grew the cabbages in their gardens which gave Cabbagetown its name.

The residents were mostly of English, Scottish or Irish birth or descent. None were well-todo, but second-generation Cabbagetowners included Rt. Hon Sir Thomas White, later finance minister of Canada, and the late R. J. Fleming, an uncle of Mr. McAree, who became mayor of Toronto.

The centre of Mr. McAree's narrative is the corner grocery store, owned by another uncle, in which he grew up. The discussion ranges from the idiosyncrasies of the store's clientele to the relative merits of small and large stores and the small shopkeeper's chances of survival against chain-store com-




